GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

- > Students should maintain discipline and decorum in the college campus.
- ➤ Undesirable behavior like being inattentive, indifferent to lessons, discourtesy to the staff members, tampering the Notice Board, damaging property, littering the campus and any undisciplined act which affect the prestige and reputation of the institution will be viewed strictly and such students will be suspended from the institution during the academic year without any notice.
- ➤ A student should not leave the class without the permission or until the lecturer has left the room or asked the class to disperse.
- ➤ Waiting in groups and talking are strictly prohibited in the corridors, verandah, and staircase or anywhere in the campus.
- > Students shall not take part in any anti-social activities or be a member of any political party. A student violating the conditions is liable to be suspended or dismissed from college.
- ➤ Students shall handle the furniture, books and any property of the organization with great care and consideration. Any loss or damage of the property will be chargeable individually or collectively.
- > Students will not hold any meetings or collect funds without the permission of the management.
- > Students are expected to adopt modest style of dressing failing which the students will be discharged from the institution at any time.
- > Use of mobile phones in college is strictly prohibited.
- As per the orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court, New Delhi and further guidelines issued by the State Government, ragging is banned and any one indulging in such acts shall be punished approximately which could include apart from criminal prosecution, expulsion from the college, suspension from the classes for a limited period or fine with public apology. The punishment may be also in the form of:
- ✓ Withholding of scholarships or other benefits
- ✓ Debarring from representation in College events

- ✓ With holding results
- ✓ Suspension or expulsion from the hostel.

IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE

- ✓ For the purpose of calculating attendance, each semester shall be taken as a Unit.
- ✓ A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for the semester, if he/she has attended not less than 75% in aggregate of the number of working periods in each of the subjects compulsorily.
- ✓ A student who fails to complete the course in the manner stated above shall not be permitted to take the University examination.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION PATTERN

- ✓ There shall be a university examination at the end of each semester. The maximum marks for the university examination in each paper shall be 70.
- ✓ Of the 30 marks of Internal Assessment of Theory Papers, 20 marks shall be based on two tests. Each test shall be of at least 30 Minutes duration to be held during the semester. The average of two tests shall be taken as the internal assessment marks. The remaining 10 marks of the Internal Assessment shall be based on Attendance.
- ✓ The marks based on attendance shall be awarded as given below:

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76\% to 80\% = 04 marks.
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81% to 85% = 06 marks.

86% to 90% = 08 marks.

91% to 100% = 10 marks.

- ✓ Internal Assessment Marks for Practical's shall be awarded by the faculty concerned based on Syllabus for Practical's provided in each Semester.
- ✓ A candidate shall apply for all the parts in each examination when he/she appears for the first time. A candidate shall be considered to have appeared for the examination only if

- he/she has submitted the prescribed application for the examination along with the required fees to the university.
- ✓ A candidate who has passed any language under Part-I shall be eligible to claim exemption from the study of the language if he/she has studied and passed the language at the corresponding level.
- ✓ Further, candidates shall also be eligible to claim exemption from studying and passing in those commerce subjects which he/she has studied and passed at the corresponding level, subject to the conditions stipulated by the university.
- ✓ A candidate who is permitted to seek admission to this degree course on transfer from any other University shall have to study and pass the subjects which are prescribed by the University. Such candidates shall not however, be eligible for the award of ranks.

- ✓ After ensuring the correctness of the particulars of the application form candidates are required to pay fees through the payment gateway integrated with the application, following the instructions available on the screen. No change/edit will be allowed thereafter.
- ✓ The payment can be made by using MASTER/VISA debit/ credit cards or Internet Banking by providing information as asked on the screen. Transaction charges for online payment will be borne by the candidates.
- ✓ On successful completion of the transaction, e-receipt and application form will be generated; which may be printed for record.
- ✓ If the online transaction is not successfully completed, the candidate will be required to register again and make payment online.

✓ The candidates are not required to send the application form to the Bank.

CLUBS AND FORUMS

Workshops and Short Term Training Programs

Health care is setup to seek maximum well being of students while teaching and promote healthy living sessions on counseling, meditation, nutritional talks, fitness and yoga programs are conducted to promote growth across all dimensions of wellness. Wellness is much more than merely physical exercise or nutrition. It is an integration of physical, mental and spiritual well being.

VET First Grade College has tied-up with some health care units located around the campus to provide medical facilities to the students as well as faculty. The college has also established a medical room equipped with First Aid. The college also encourages specialty health care units to organize medical camps on free of cost

to the students and faculty. Every year, a thorough medical checkup is provided to all the students to ensure that they are physically fit to cope up with the stress and strain of their academic journey.

ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

Ragging includes any conduct by any student/s whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, indulging in rowdy undisciplined activities by students causing annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or raising fear or apprehension in any fresher or student.

It also includes any act affecting the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without intent to derive asadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student, and all such incidents.

The committee has to ensure enough steps are taken to create Awareness on the topic.

- ✓ If in case any person approaches any of the committee member, the member is immediately required to inform others and call for the meeting
- ✓ A written complaint is required to be taken from the aggrieved person, necessary action to be taken, preferably to settle the matter through counseling and conciliations soon as possible in case the matter is not sorted, inquiry to be conducted and matter to be sorted out within 10 days from the date of complaint.
- ✓ The members to be vigilant all the time and ensure that there is no such incident taking place in campus by creating awareness and having an open dialogue with all the students.
- ✓ The committee is expected to be vigilant and to ensure that the students open up and discuss their major issues with the members. It is their duty to take initiative and indulge into a

- dialogue with those students who are observed to be silent, non-participative and/or show any kind of unusual behaviour.
- ✓ It is most important to ensure that the students interact and come out of their personal problems so that they succeed in their efforts, and this would prevent suicidal instincts in them.

CONNECTION BETWEEN INTERNAL ASSESSMENT MARKS AND ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Of the 30 marks of Internal Assessment of Theory Papers, 20 marks shall be based on two tests. Each test shall be of at least 30 Minutes duration to be held during the semester. The average of two tests shall be taken as the internal assessment marks. The remaining 10 marks of the Internal Assessment shall be based on Attendance.

The marks based on attendance shall be awarded as given below:

76% to 80% = 04 marks.

81% to 85% = 06 marks.

86% to 90% = 08 marks.

91% to 100% = 10 marks.

Internal Assessment Marks for Practicals shall be awarded by the faculty concerned based on Syllabus for Practicals provided in each Semester.

ETHICAL VALUES AND BEHAVIORAL POLICY

Its our goal to see that each student at VET is successful, such are a byproduct of faculty, staff and to maintain an intellectual challenging environment and to mould a better citizen to the nation the ethical values and behavioural policy are drafted.

This Code shall apply to all kinds of conduct of students that occurs on the Institute premises including in University sponsored activities, functions hosted by other recognized student organizations and any off-campus conduct that has or may have serious consequences or adverse impact on the Institute's Interests or reputation.

✓ The Institute shall have the jurisdiction over the conduct of the students associated /enrolled with the Institute and to take cognizance of all acts of misconduct including incidents of ragging or otherwise which are taking place on the Institute

- campus or in connection with the Institute related activities and functions.
- ✓ Institute may also exercise jurisdiction over conduct which occurs off-campus violating the ideal student conduct and discipline as laid down in this Policy and other regulations, as if the conduct has occurred on campus which shall include
- ✓ Any violations of the Sexual Harassment Policy of the Institute against other students of the Institute.
- ✓ Physical assault, threats of violence, or conduct that threatens the health or safety of any person including other students of the Institute;
- ✓ Possession or use of weapons, explosives, or destructive devices off campus
- ✓ Manufacture, sale, or distribution of prohibited drugs, alcohol etc.
- ✓ Conduct which has a negative impact or constitutes a nuisance to members of the surrounding off-campus community.
- ✓ The Institute, while determining whether or not to exercise such off-campus jurisdiction in situations enumerated hereinabove, the Institute shall consider the seriousness of the alleged offense, the risk of harm involved, whether the victim(s) are members of the campus community and/or whether the off campus conduct is part of a series of actions, which occurred both on, and off-campus.
- ✓ At the time of admission, each student must sign a statement accepting this Code and by giving an undertaking that
- ✓ He/she shall be regular and must complete his/her studies in the Institute.
- ✓ In the event, a student is forced to discontinue studies for any legitimate reason, such a student may be relieved from the Institute subject to written consent of the principal.
- ✓ As a result of such relieving, the student shall be required to clear pending hostel / mess dues and if a student had joined the Institute on a scholarship, the said grant shall be revoked.
- ✓ Institute believes in promoting a safe and efficient climate by enforcing behavioral standards. All students must uphold

academic integrity, respect all persons and their rights and property and safety of others; etc.

All students must deter from indulging in any and all forms of misconduct including partaking in any activity off-campus which can affect the Institute's interests and reputation substantially. The various forms of misconduct include:

- a) Any act of discrimination (physical or verbal conduct) based on an individual's gender, caste, race, religion or religious beliefs, colour, region, language, disability, or sexual orientation, marital or family status, physical or mental disability, gender identity, etc.
- b) Intentionally damaging or destroying Institute property or property of other students and/or faculty members.
- c) Any disruptive activity in a class room or in an event sponsored by the Institute
- d) Unable to produce the identity card, issued by the Institute, or refusing to produce it on demand by campus security guards
- ✓ Organizing meetings and processions without permission from the Institute.
- ✓ Unauthorized possession or use of harmful chemicals and banned drugs
- \checkmark Smoking on the campus of the Institute
- ✓ Possessing, Consuming, distributing, selling of alcohol in the Institute and/or throwing empty bottles on the campus of the Institute
- ✓ Parking a vehicle in a no parking zone or in area earmarked for parking other type of vehicles
- ✓ Rash driving on the campus that may cause any inconvenience to others
- ✓ Not disclosing a pre-existing health condition, either physical or psychological, to the Chief Medical Officer which may cause hindrance to the academic progress.
- ✓ Theft or unauthorized access to others resources
- ✓ Misbehavior at the time of student body elections or during any activity of the Institute.

- ✓ Engaging in disorderly, lewd, or indecent conduct, including, but not limited to, creating unreasonable noise; pushing and shoving; inciting or participating in a riot or group disruption at the Institute.
- ✓ Students are expected not to interact, on behalf of the Institute, with media representatives or invite media persons on to the campus without the permission of the Institute authorities.
- ✓ Students are not permitted to either audio or video record lectures in class rooms or actions of other students, faculty, or staff without prior permission.
- ✓ Students are not permitted to provide audio and video clippings of any activity on the campus to media without prior permission.
- ✓ Damage to, or destruction of, any property of the Institute, or any property of others on the Institute premises.
- ✓ Making a video/audio recording, taking photographs, or streaming audio/video of any person in a location where the person has a reasonable expectation of privacy, without that person's knowledge and express consent.

College Alumni Association:


