Report

The webinar titled **Implementation of National education Policy 2020** was organised by VET First Grade College in association with CESS- Centre for Educational and Social Science and BUFGCPA- Bangalore University First Grade College Principal's association. The master of Ceremony was done by Ms. Dharani from CESS. She started the session by highlighting the objective of the webinar – to enable the heads to understand the steps, process and support available to the institutions in implementation of NEP 2020.

Next, Dr Gowrish from CESS welcomed Resource person, office bearers of BUFGCPA, Dr Manandi N Suresh and Sr B R Viswanath Setty, the management members of VET FGC and all the participating Principals, management representatives and other participants. This was followed by opening remark on NEP and today's webinar that was rendered by Dr Anuradha, Secretary BUFGCPA. Then Dr Harish and Dr Padmaja, office bearers of BUFGCPA gave a brief introduction of the Resource Person Dr Rajendra Kumar V Joshi and Dr Padmavathi B S respectively. Then Ms. Dharani handed over the session to the resource person.

Dr Padmavathi began the webinar with the policy vision of NEP 2020. She spoke in detail about the structural changes and transformative changes required for the implementation of the NEP 2020. She highlighted about the micro level changes required at the institutional level like building infrastructure, networking, equity and access and others required for making the institution NEP ready. She also spoke about the Blended learning which is the new normal and

cited the current example of how virtual learning and teaching have become the need of the hour in the light of existing and ongoing pandemic. She also mentioned that institutions should give more scope for research and innovation and setting up of incubation centers.

Dr Rajendra Kumar continued the session and highlighted that NEP has given provisions for online teaching and learning to the extent of 40% of the curriculum. He spoke in detail about what changed needed to be embraced to be NEP ready. He stressed that one major that institutions have to be ready is with respect to the holistic and multidisciplinary education in the process of creating a knowledge society and to achieve this, a change in pedagogy is the key. This pedagogy should be more interactive approach and should highly dwell on feedback from all stakeholders especially students. Along with this, time management is also the key as time plus energy leads to better learning. He mentioned that for institutions to be NEP Ready, 3 As play a key role – Aware, Act and Achieve. He mentioned that all the stakeholders should be aware, then act on it which in turn will lead to achievement. He also assured the participants that CESS is ready to hand hold the institutions towards this goal. He concluded his presentation with this note and assurance.

Then the floor was open for discussion and queries. Prof Mahesh K M posted question pertaining to the number of courses sanctioned for evening college and wanted an opinion on the same in NEP. To this, Dr Rajendra Kumar said that as NEP gives autonomy to institutions to design their own curriculum and hence simplifies this issue and mentioned that vocational education would be integrated with main stream education.

Next question was posted by Dr Bhavani from Surana College, who asked about mentoring by CESS, to which the resource person replied in affirmation that CESS would be more than happy to hand hold the institution at the various stages. Next question was posted by Dr R Parvathi who asked about how to Act and Achieve (2 As) of the implementation process. To this, Dr Rajendra replied that for acting, the process is that institutions should interact with all stakeholders and based on the vision of the institution, should conduct SWOC analysis, identify gaps and act accordingly. This entire process may take 1 year for the college. Next Dr Nanda from BMS College posted a question on the pattern of years 3+2,4+1 or 5 years as envisaged by NEP 2020 and asked for which the institution should be ready. To this the resource person replied that


college should start preparing for 4 year program giving exit option at each the end of each year and also mentioned that even regulators have a role to play here.

Dr Srikanta B S from Sindhi College asked whether the exit option at the end of each year would be accepted by the industry? To this, the resource person replied that the pedagogy should be modified in such a manner that students achieve some skill at the time of exit option at each level. To a question posted on the time of implementation of NEP, Dr Padmavathi replied that at the Central level, 2021-22 is been targeted and at state level it would probably take more time i.e. 2022-23. She also mentioned that UP Government has already come out with Draft Task force report on implementation. Dr Parvathi asked about the financial implications for the management which was also the query of Mrs Lakshmi Ganesh, management representative of MLA College. Dr Rajendra Kumar pointed out that it would be economical to management when NEP is introduced and said that financial allocation could be spread out in a phased manner. Dr Padmavathi added that the affiliation fees would not be payable by the institution in the longer run and also mentioned that institutions aimed at ensuring quality education alone would sustain and survive in the future.

The session concluded by vote of thanks proposed by Mrs. B Rammya, IQAC Coordinator, VET First Grade College thanking the resource persons and all the organisers and participants for their presence, active participation and deliberations during the meeting.

Overall, the session was informational, intellectual and enlightened the participants about the implementation of NEP 2020.

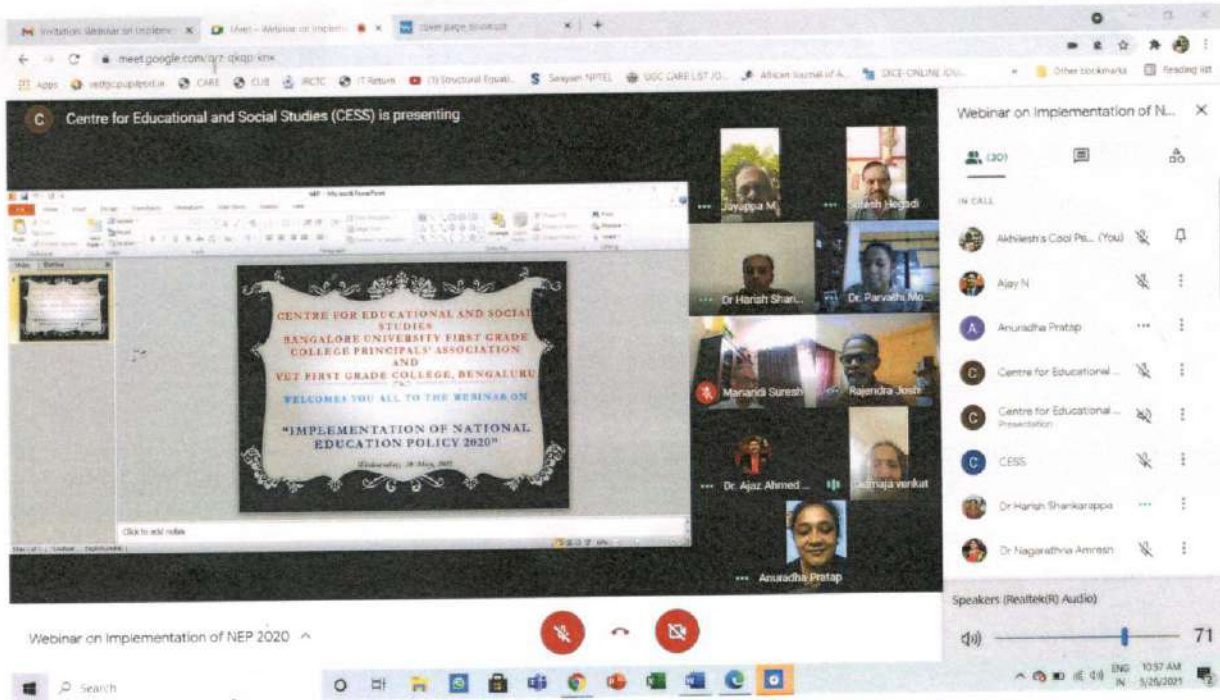
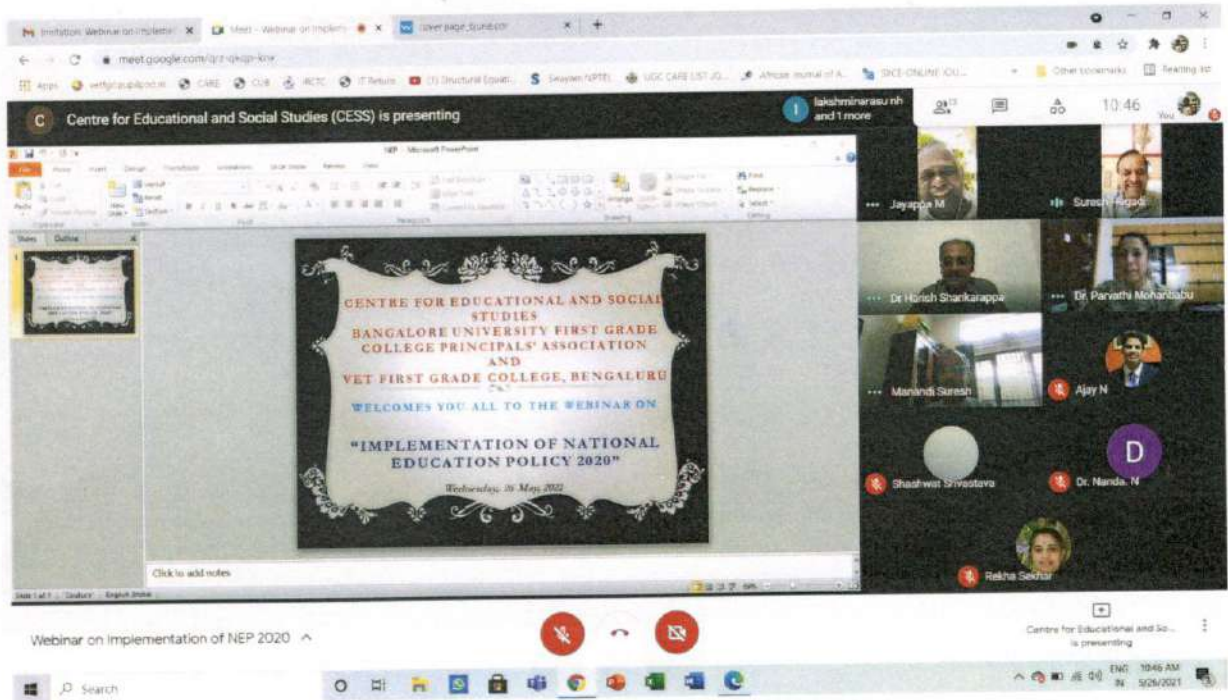

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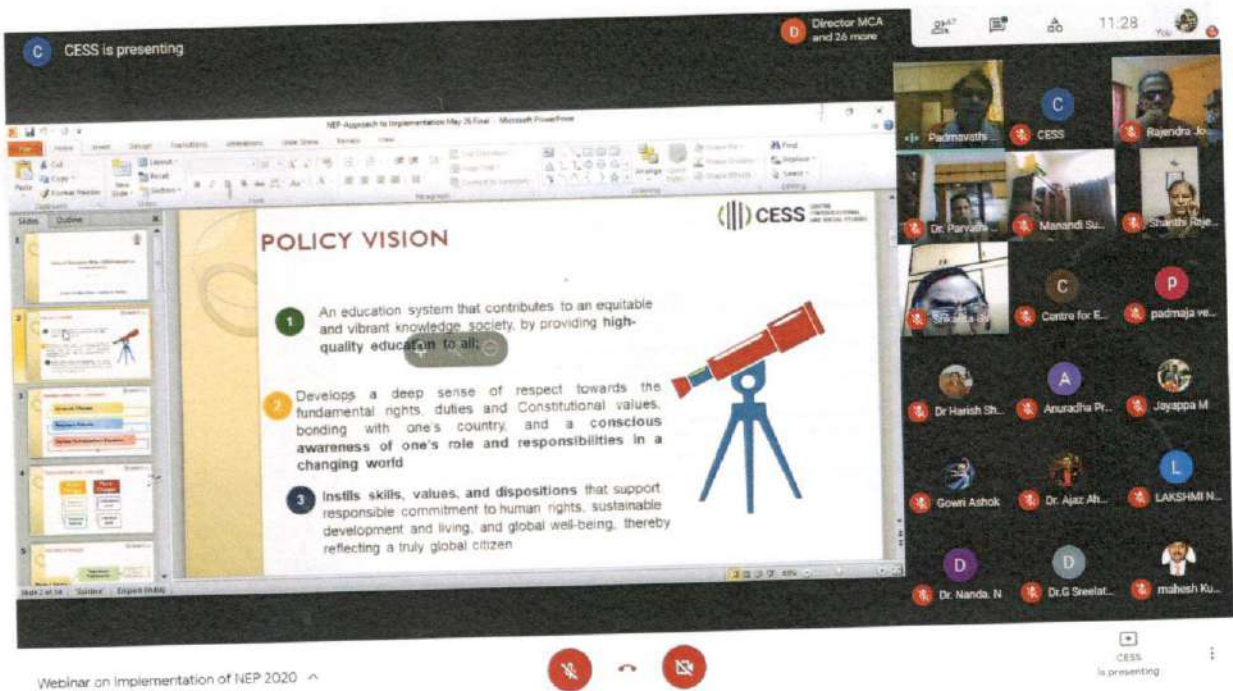

Mrs. B Rammya, PG and IQAC Coordinator started the session by welcoming the resource person and proudly stating how Mr. Sharath Chandra B R is a proud alumni of the institution from MCOM batch of 2018-20 and has come back to his alma mater for a guest lecture. Then Dr Sathya Bhama introduced the resource person highlighting his area of expertise which is GST and how apt it is to have him deliver this special lecture on GST Introduction and Practical aspects.

Then Mr. Sharath Chandra started the session by asking all the students to just turn on the video for a minute to have a face-to-face touch in the virtual meet. He started the session by raising the students about tax – direct and indirect. He explained in detail what is tax , what is direct taxation, what is indirect taxation, GST, meaning with an example, the practical way to calculate the selling price and how GST reduces the prices and avoids cascading effect. He also highlighted in detail about the history of GST – when was it conceived and when it was implemented (01 July 2017). He then discussed about CGST, SCST, IGST and IGST. He also explained in detail as what is included in GST and what is outside the purview of GST. He also spoke about what is supply in GST and when it is treated as supply, place of supply, the GST registration, the limit when registration is

compulsory, normal registration, composite registration and explained with many real-life examples and problems.

He also explained how a GSTIN number is generated and how to read and infer it and the rates of GST applicable for goods and service and how the same is calculated. He then explained the concepts again with case studies.

Overall, it was an intellectual and interactive session with lots of practical examples discussed and few cases covered.

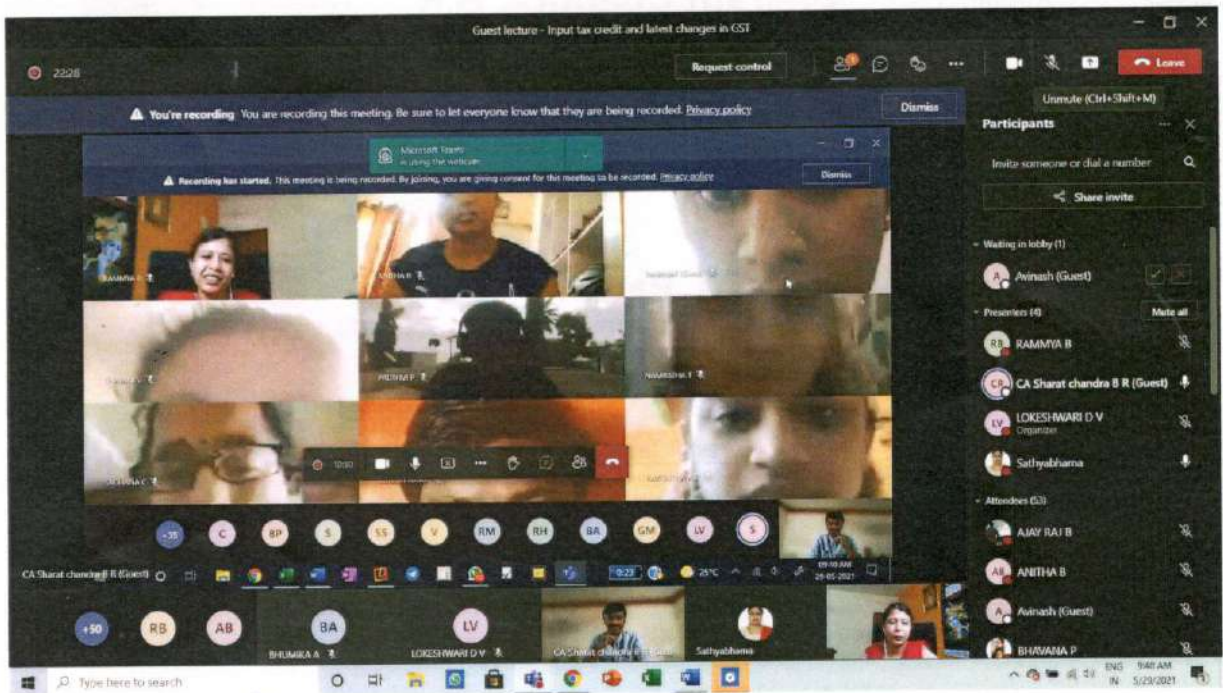
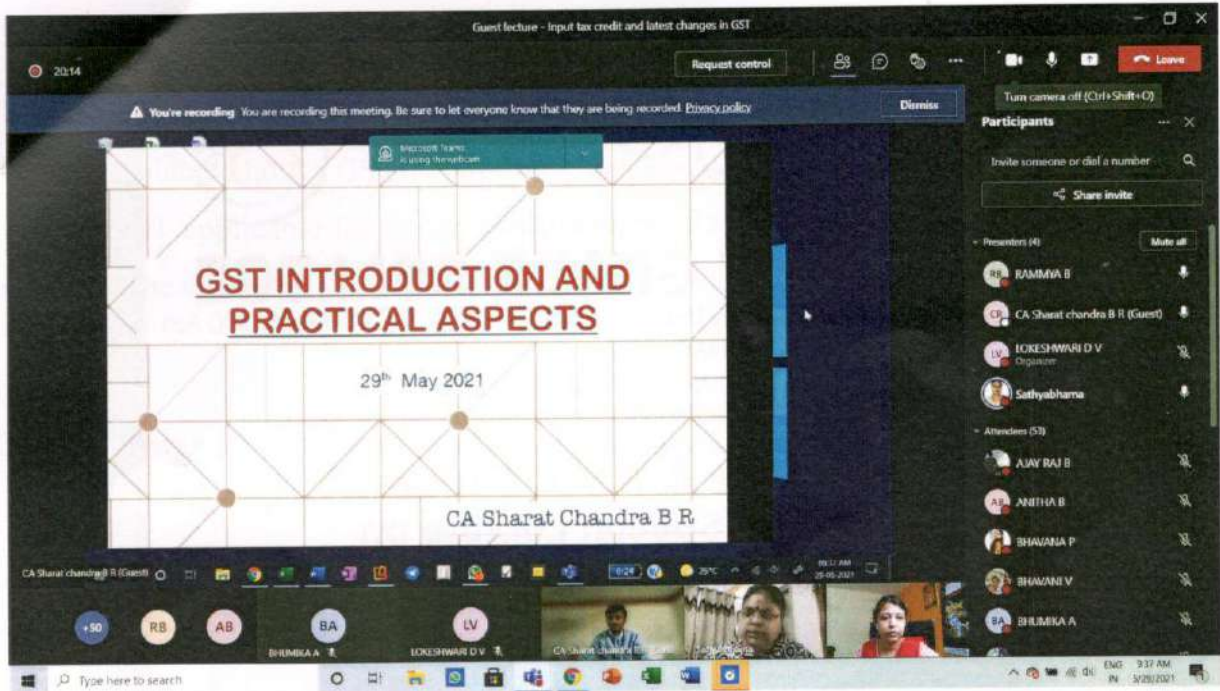

GST is a value added tax levied on supply i.e., manufacture or sale of goods and provision of services. **VALUE ADDED TAX**

GST offers comprehensive and continuous chain of tax credits from the producer's point/service provider's point upto the retailer's level/consumer's level thereby taxing only the value added at each stage of supply chain. **CONTINUOUS CHAIN OF TAX CREDITS**

The supplier at each stage is permitted to avail credit of GST paid on the purchase of goods and/or services and can set off this credit against the GST payable on the supply of goods and services to be made by him. Thus, only the final consumer bears the GST charged by the last supplier in the supply chain, with set-off benefits at all the previous stages. **BURDEN BORNE BY FINAL CONSUMER**

Since, only the value added at each stage is taxed under GST, there is no tax on tax or cascading of taxes under GST system. The same can be understood better with the help of the following example: **NO CASCADING OF TAXES**

History of GST implementation

In the year 2000, the then Prime Minister introduced the concept of GST and set up a committee to design a GST model for the country.

2000: GST Council recommends all the rules.

2006: Announcement by Union Finance Minister, during budget of 2006-07 that GST would introduced from 1 April 2010.

2006: The Constitution (122nd Amendment) Bill was introduced in the Lok Sabha.

2014: GST Council Recommends CGST, SGST, IGST, UTGST & Compensation Cess Bill.

2016 (Aug): The Constitution (101st Amendment) Act was enacted.

2017 (Mar): 1st GST Council.

2017 (Apr): CGST, IGST, UTGST and Compensation Cess.

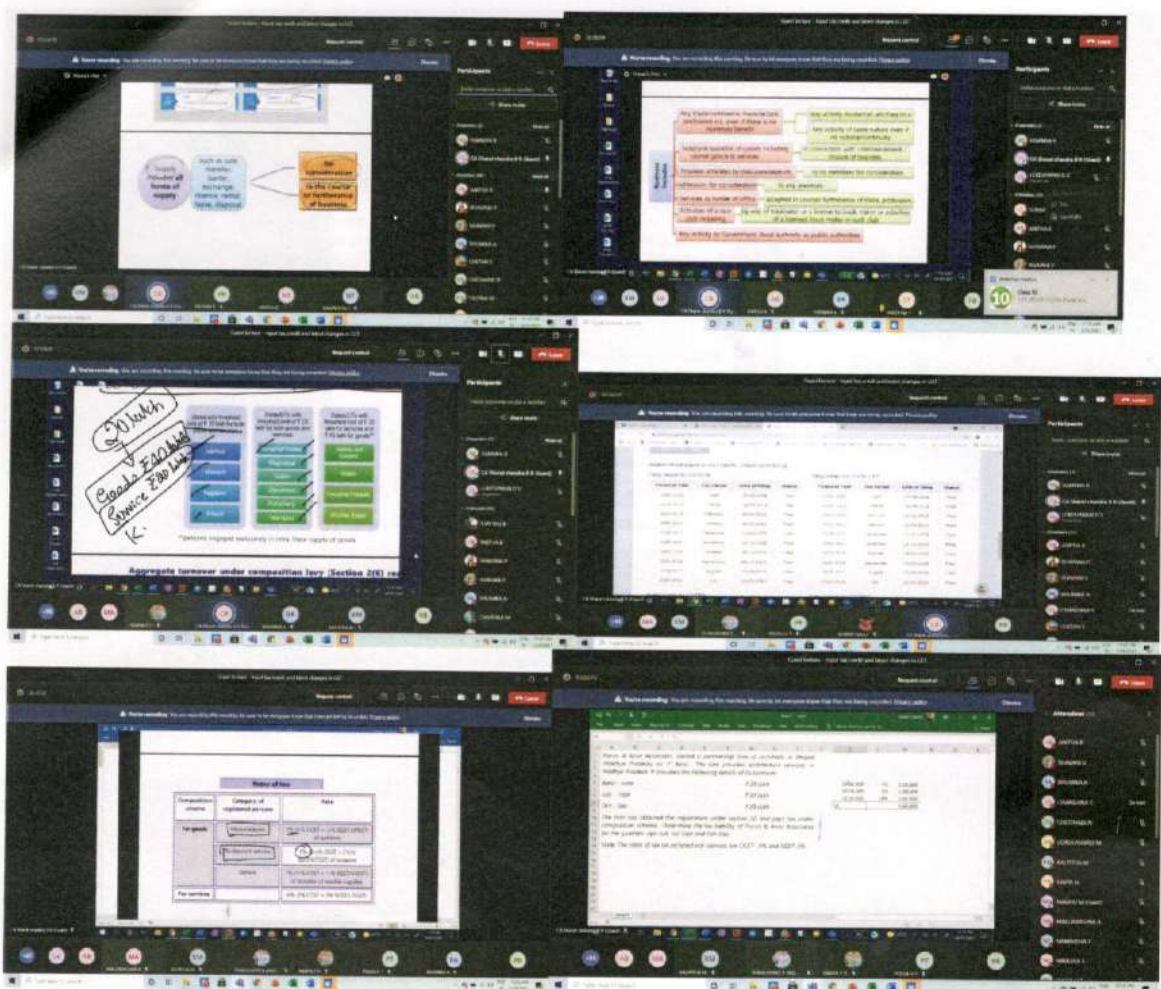

Report

VET First Grade College organised a two-day International Webinar titled Interdisciplinary Approach in Management for Faculty and PG students in the capacity of co-associate with SSMRV, Primax Foundation, Shrimati Indira Gandhi College (W), Trichy and Ties-Ups International, Indonesia. The webinar was organised for 2 days namely 20th Feb 2021 and 21st Feb 2021. It was attended by over 190 participants from across Bangalore, Chennai, Trichy, Malaysia, and Indonesia.

The program began on 20th Feb 2021 with a welcome by Prof Rajeshwari, President Primax Foundation who welcomed all the resource person, Convenor Dr Anil Kumar from SSMRV, Dr Parvathi from VET First Grade College, all coordinators, and the participants. Mrs. Rammya, IQAC and PG Coordinator, VET first Grade College introduced the first resource person for the day – Dr B Ramesh and handed over the session to Dr Ramesh to throw light on the topic “ Applied Research-Emerging Opportunities in Management and Commerce”.

Dr Ramesh spoke about the recent trends in commerce and management and highlighted about the top sectors in hiring for the current year which included BFSI-Banking and Financial Services Institution, BPO, KPO and ITES-Information Technology enabled services. He also spoke about the skill gaps and pointed out that these gaps to be filled in the educational institution so that students become employable. The skills that he quoted as extremely important include communication skills and pointed out that the current buzz word in the industry is Business Analytics. He also highlighted about NEP, spoke about Academic Bank Credit, skills on data management, CMIE Prowess database and stressed that faculty and students should

publish their work in journals. He quoted that Business Process Automation, Machine Learning, Artificial Intelligence, creative space in business, youtuber, independent trainer and mentor career, business analyst and big data analyst are the trending opportunities available to students and stressed on the importance of skills required to acquire these jobs. The session was deeply knowledgeable, relevant and threw light on the emerging opportunities for faculty and students.

The next resource person – Dr Kothari was introduced by Prof Lavanya Balaji from SSMRV. His topic for the day was on “Energy and Environment Problems Facing the third World and Their Probable Solutions for Sustainable Development and Poverty Alleviation”. He spoke about the various theories in management and linked them to the ancient Indian wisdom derived from epics like Bhagwat Geetha, Ramayana, and Mahabharata. He spoke about self-control, control of mind, perseverance, leadership and linked all these with the slokas from Bhagwat Geetha. He said that all these theories of management have their deep roots in our ancient and rich cultural and epical heritage. He started the session with basics of entrepreneur and put forth a thought-provoking question – Are entrepreneurs born or made? He spoke about the essentials to

be an entrepreneur, the skill set required for a successful entrepreneur, the traits required by them and highlighted on how an entrepreneur should behave and be ready to face any unforeseen situations like the current on-going COVID 19 Pandemic. He finally concluded by saying that entrepreneurs are hybrid – both born and made. His session was highly knowledgeable and inculcated the spirit of entrepreneurship among the participants.

The two-day webinar ended with vote of thanks by Mr. Ravi Makhija, Founder & Director TIE-UPS International, Jakarta, Indonesia, who thanked all the resource people for the webinar, Primax Foundation, the principals of organising colleges, coordinators of the program and all the participants. He concluded that the day international webinar was a knowledge sharing platform for both faculty and students alike.



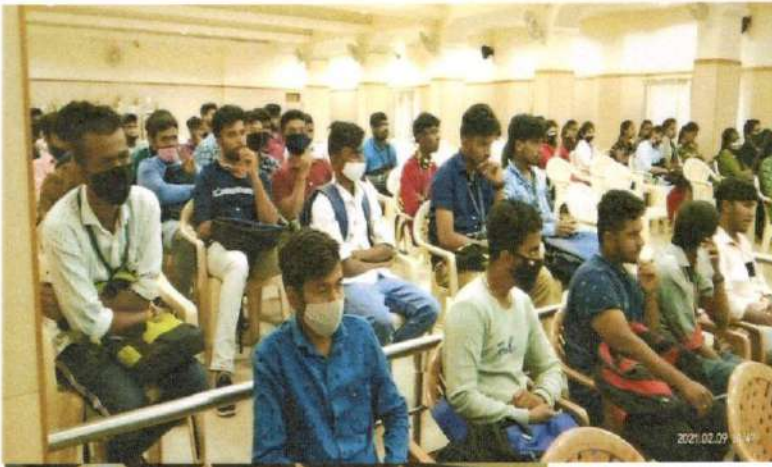

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Report on FDP titled “ Sample Calculation and Writing Research Proposal.”

Date: 20/01/2021

Day: Wednesday

The Faculty development program (FDP) titled “ Sample Calculation and writing research proposal” was conducted in the college for all faculty members and final year Mcom students. The objective of the FDP was to understand the concept of Sample and sample calculation which is the most needed aspect in Research and writing research papers and to understand the drafting of research proposal which would further ensure applying for research projects for the institution and ensure funding as well.

The program started with brief welcome by Mrs. Rammya, IQAC Coordinator who welcomed the resource person Dr K V Ramanathan, Associate Professor, Dept. of Commerce, PG Department, St Claret College, Bangalore, Dr R Parvathi – Academic Director and Principal, Dr Sreelatha, all faculty members and the final year Mcom students. She then invited Dr R Parvathi to address the faculty on the importance of the topic chosen for the FDP. After a brief introduction of the resource person, Mrs Rammya handed over the session to Dr K V Ramanathan

Dr Ramanathan expressed gratitude to the Principal and the management of VET First Grade College for inviting him as the resource person for the one-day FDP. He began the session by giving the agenda for the FDP i) Sample calculation ii) Writing Research Proposal. He started with basic concepts like population, census, sample, sampling frame and sample unit. He also stressed that for any research, three ingredients are very important which includes statement of problem, objective and framing hypothesis.

He explained in detail regarding the various Probability Sampling methods which includes:

- Simple random sampling
- Stratified sampling
- Cluster sampling
- Systematic sampling

He then explained about the Non-probability methods which includes:

- Convenience sampling
- Consecutive sampling
- Quota sampling
- Judgmental Sampling
- Snowball sampling

He explained these concepts with apt examples. He then explained the terms like Significance level and also showed how to calculate the Z scores at various significance levels and Z scores being 1.65, 1.96 and 2.58. He then explained about the margin of error and started with the calculation of sample size.

Sample size calculation concept was invented by W Morgan and he has come out with Morgan's Table. He explained the formula used for calculation of sample size for unknown population and also for the known population. He also practically explained how to use the online free calculator for calculation of sample size and mentioned that it can be calculated only for known population. Then he started the discussion on Research proposal writing. He highlighted that funding is available from ICSSR, UGC and other private agencies. He then explained in detail how to apply for funding from ICSSR and mentioned that ICSSR funds certain projects throughout the year and certain projects on need basis by inviting application through advertisement. He mentioned the procedure to apply in the online portal in detail and mentioned that institutions should initially apply for minor projects for a duration of 6-12 months with funding of up to Rs 4.99 Lakhs and then on this basis, the institutions can apply for major project which range for 2-


3 year with a funding of more than Rs 4.99 Lakhs. He practically demonstrated by showing the ICSSR project that the resource person had applied recently.

The session ended with vote of thanks by Mrs. Rammya. Overall, the FDP very lively, interesting and informative and all the faculty members and students learnt in detail about the sample calculation and the research proposal writing.

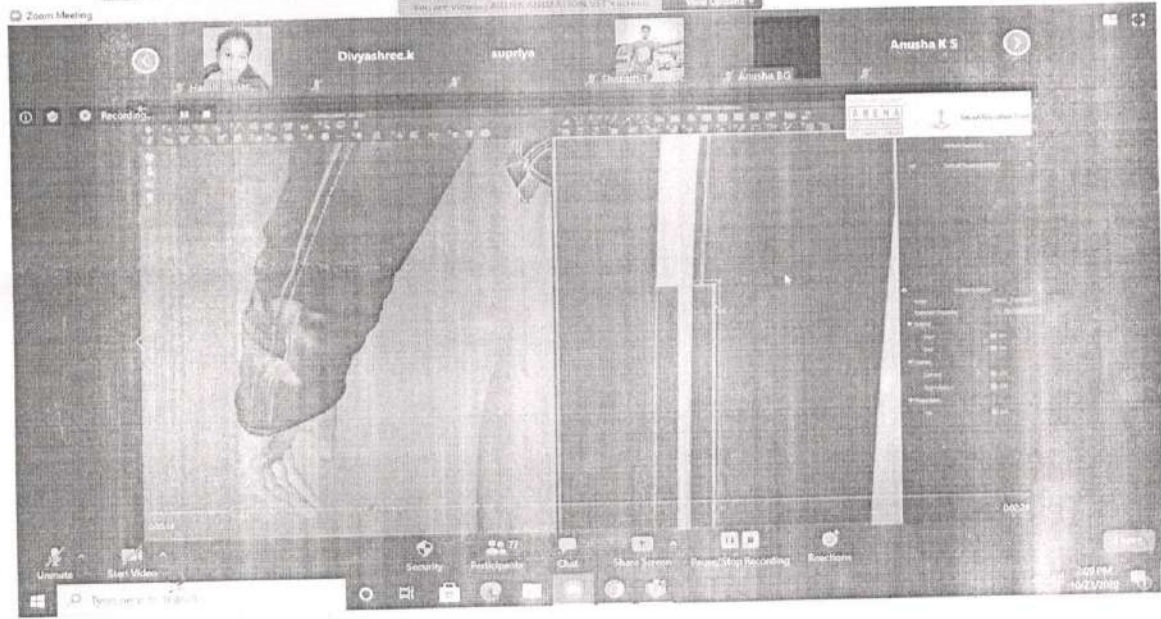
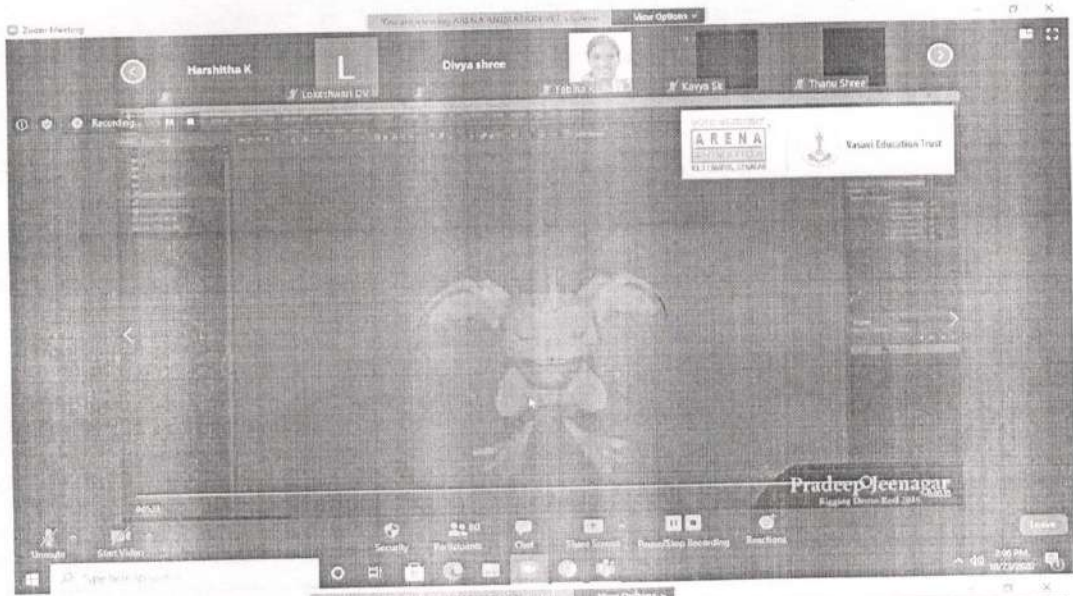

04-October 2020 – Second Day





Report on Unfolding New Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020)

The Faculty Development Programme - Webinar on “Unfolding New Education Policy 2020” was organised by VET First Grade College on 30-Aug-2020 from 11.00 am to 1.00pm. The resource person for the seminar was Dr. B S Srikanta, Former President of BUPA and Principal of Sindhi College. The webinar was organised virtually on ZOOM platform with Meeting Id 878 6397 7864. The webinar was telecasted live on you tube as well and was attended by 125 participants / faculties from Colleges, Schools and Polytechnic. The webinar commenced with introduction about the speaker by Dr R Parvathi, Academic Director and Principal, VET Colleges. The resource person gave a detailed talk on the NEP 2020 and the gist of the webinar is as under.

The New Education policy , NEP in short was unfolded by PM Narendra Modi on 29/7/2020 as a public document. It has encompassed 2 lakhs suggested received from teaching and other stakeholders across the nation. The objective of NEP being education to all and holistic development of human being. It is being implemented as 5+3+3+4 system where the initial 5 years belong to KG to 2nd standard termed as Foundation level, next 3 years for 3rd -5th standard termed as Preparatory level, next 3 years for 6th-8th standard termed as Middle level and the last 4 years belonging to 9th -12th standards known as Secondary level. The resource person gave complete details on the pedagogy and the syllabus which would be introduced at each of these levels. He stressed that the NEP is a light but tight framework stressing more on research and importance being given on formative and continuous assessment through the students career. He also emphasized that the NEP focusses on no hard core separation

between streams and is a multi disciplinary education where students can choose vocational course based on their skill set and interest and develop deeper into it in their higher education.

He also emphasises that at the secondary level, cafeteria approach i.e subject oriented pedagogy divulging deeper into subject based on the interest of the students and with multi disciplinary aspect of education. The NEP also focusses on mother tongue/ regional languages being used as a medium of instruction at the school level. Regarding the examination, the speaker said that Exams will be conducted only for 3rd, 5th and 8th grades and Board exam would be conducted for 10th and 12th grades only thereby relieving the students of the burden and tension. He also spoke about assessment and accreditation of the institution and highlighted that NEP envisages the assessment and accreditation at the school level and said that PARAKH would be the body for assessment at the school level and NTA – National Testing Agency at the college exam.

At the higher education level, he said that all Under graduation courses would be 4 years with multiple entry and exit points with certificate been awarded after 1 year, diploma after 2 years exit, Bachelors degree after 3 years exit and Honours degree after 4 years exit. The concept of NEP is totally internationalisation of education system and making it on par with Global education. He also spoke about the requirement from teaching community for the new system. He mentioned that the NEP would be introduced in a phased manner and would become a reality in real sense in 2035. He also emphasised that NEP places thrust on online and open distance learning and aims to increase the GER-Gross Enrolment Ratio to 50% from the current 26% by 2035 and also mentioned that all college would become degree granting autonomous college by 2035. He also spoke of the challenges in the implementation and mentioned that it is step in the right direction for India to become Global Education Hub. He also addressed the queries of all the faculties as well.

The webinar ended with Dr Manādi N Suresh showering appreciation on the resource person for his detailed account of the NEP 2020 and vote of thanks proposed by Dr Sathyabhama B N. It was an enlightening session and all the faculties who attended has an overall view of the NEP 2020.

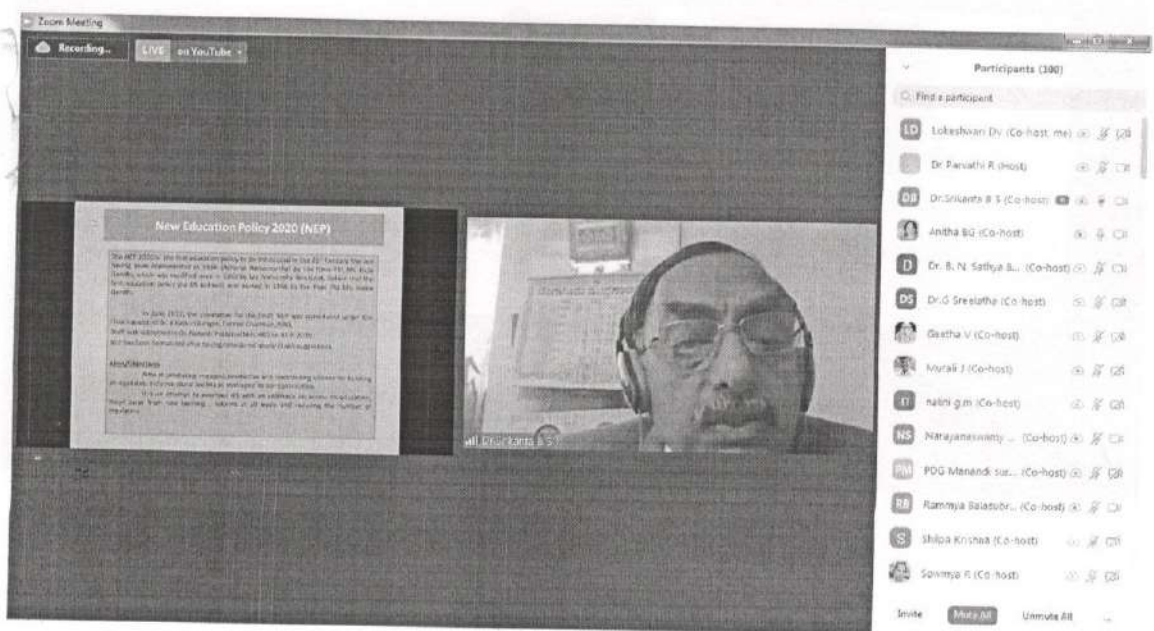
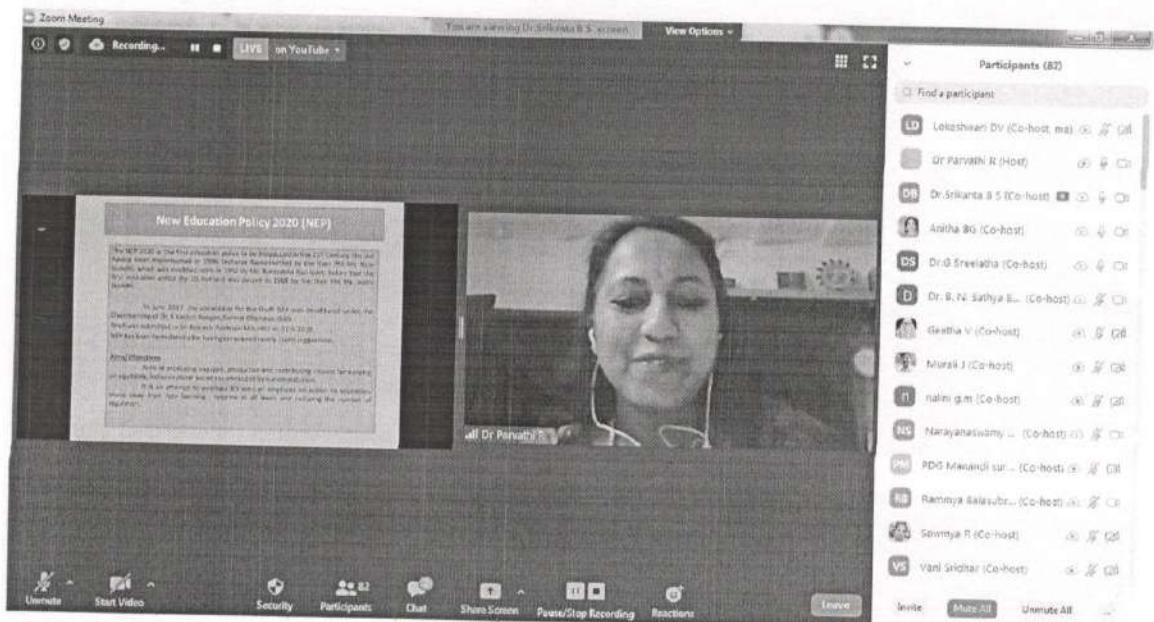

Report on Make it or Break it

VET First Grade College organized a virtual special lecture on "Make it or Break it" in association with ISKCON on 18th December 2020, Friday at 1.00 pm. Around 100 Students of I Semester B.com, BBA, BCA and B.Sc. Fad attended the session through Zoom platform with meeting ID 97043582644 and with you -tube live telecast <https://youtu.be/U2eGEqaeVg>.

Ms Gowri Hebbar, Assoc Professor Department of Commerce welcomed the resource person, Sri Vishnu Dhuta Dasa , Dr. R Parvathi, Principal and academic director of VETFGC , Mr. Praveen Krishna , Program co-ordinator, faculty members and students. And she introduced the speaker of the day, Sri Vishnu Dhuta Dasa.

Resource person Sri Vishnu Dhuta Dasa began the session and started explaining about how we deal with our habits.

He briefed that according to an American Journal of psychology, Habit is a fixed way of thinking, willing or feeling acquired through previous repetitions of a mental experience. And he highlighted the types of habits as constructive habits and destructive habits. He stated good habits increase our confidence, energy and empower us. He gave an example of a big elephant tied for a small wood peck and it is restricted by its constrained strength, which could never explore how ever strongest it would be to deal any other obstacles. He showed an instructive video about how the insect got trapped and dies in Venus flytrap.

He explained habits loop, routine, reward and cue with a video of Rat, an experiment made in MIT which is about the habit loop of rat and peak signal and also mentioned researchers have mapped human behavior to chemicals that get released in the body. There are two habit reinforcement techniques-Mind amplification technique and Pasting techniques.

He asked students that can we go on adding chemicals from external sources forever. And shared a video which completely spoils health of a bird which felt sweet could give pleasure. He took sayings of Krishna and told that the happiness which is derived from contact of the senses with their objects and which appears like nectar at first but poisons at the end is said to be of the nature of the passion.

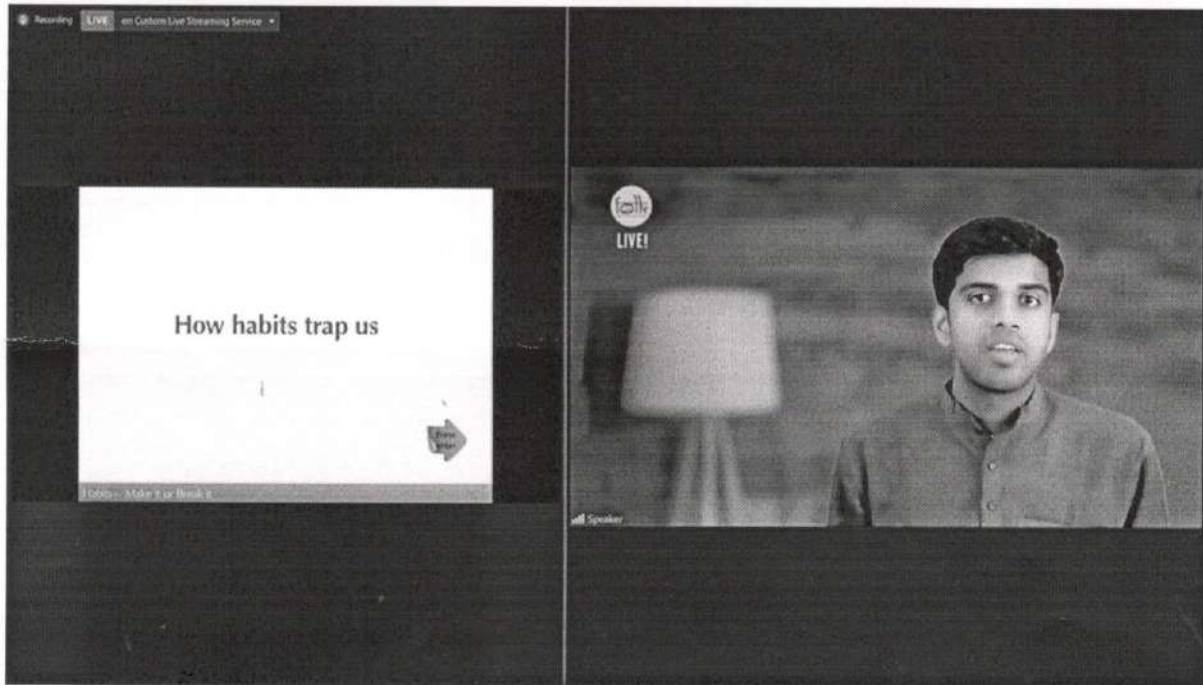
He stated that human brain is neuron plastic and we can rewire and rethink again so that we can remove bad habits and rewire with constructive habits. Interdisciplinary Social Science research includes training, financial, professional and cultural factors of the society. To achieve all these road map including short term and long term goals are required to be researched in depth was explained in detail. She highlighted the emerging areas like Visual culture, Cartography, Medical Humanities and others were briefed along with Artificial Intelligence impacts. She concluded her speech by targeting **GENERATION Z** to acknowledge how Social Science can make Artificial Intelligence more human with the combination of Social Science, Artificial intelligence and Human Computer Interaction.

At 12.30 p.m. Dr. R. Parvathi delivered the concluding remarks of Two Day International Webinar and thanked all the dignitaries’, resource persons, participants and organizers.

Report on web cast on "Visible light communication"

VET First Grade College organized a webinar on **Visible Light Communication** on 6th June 2020 at 10AM. The webinar was conducted for all the BCA students through Zoom platform with meeting id: 75856831893, password: bca.

Dr.R.Parvathi principal & academic director VET FGC, welcomed the resource person. Tanuja .H introduced the resource person and welcomed all the faculty members, students.

Resource person Dr.Parvathi Angadi, Professor K.L.E College took the session and started explain about visible light communication.

She gave a brief introduction about the new technology for communication using visible light. She explained why we need this new technology by considering its features like ever increasing market share of LED's, safe and secure communication .

She continued the session by describing various technologies using light spectrum. The various technologies used are free space optics, optical camera communications, light fidelity (LiFi). She explained about basic components of VLC's. The components of VLC are transmitters, transmission medium and receiver. She also gave some examples of these components. The step by step VLC process was explained by using diagrams.

She highlighted the layer architecture of VLC. The protocol used in VLC architecture is IEEE 802.15.7. The layer architecture has 3 layers. The first layer of this architecture is application layer which specifies the shared communication protocols and interface methods used by hosts in the communication network. The second layer of VLC is MAC layer which provides a reliable link between peer MAC entities and it points the packets of data towards its intended directions. The third layer is physical layer where input bits passes through a series of process before it reaches the light source. The light source then emits photons through an optical channel via light signals. These signals are received by the photo diode device, which is demodulated and transcribed into output data.

She explained all the applications of VLC such as wireless networking by light, indoor applications, in office room, in hospitals, in buildings, vehicular networks, visible light id system, and underwater applications.

The RBI announced to hold back the installments for 180days which brings a huge relief for term loan borrowers like home loan, car loan etc. RBI governor Shaktikanta Das announced that all banks are being permitted to allow a moratorium of 180days on payment of installments in respect of all term loans outstanding as on March 1, 2020. She started the session with briefing what is stress and how it can controlled, detailed about how does it happen? Causes for stress like expectation of parents and teachers, Competition with the student in the class, so much to do, with less time, students expectation, the anxiety, sleep habits and family conditions and others. continued with how a student will know that they are stressed by Feeling discouraged about academic progress, Lack of confidence in quality of work, Deterioration in physical appearance or personal hygiene, Sleep changes (sleeping too much or too little, being tired all the time), Changes in or exaggeration of personality traits, Unprovoked anger or hostility, Irritability, constant anxiety, or weepiness and others.

After briefing about what and how does it happen? She started to stating about how stress can be controlled like procrastination – it is an emotional response, time management and prioritization about which is important and not important ,difference between urgent and not urgent and also tips for exam day.

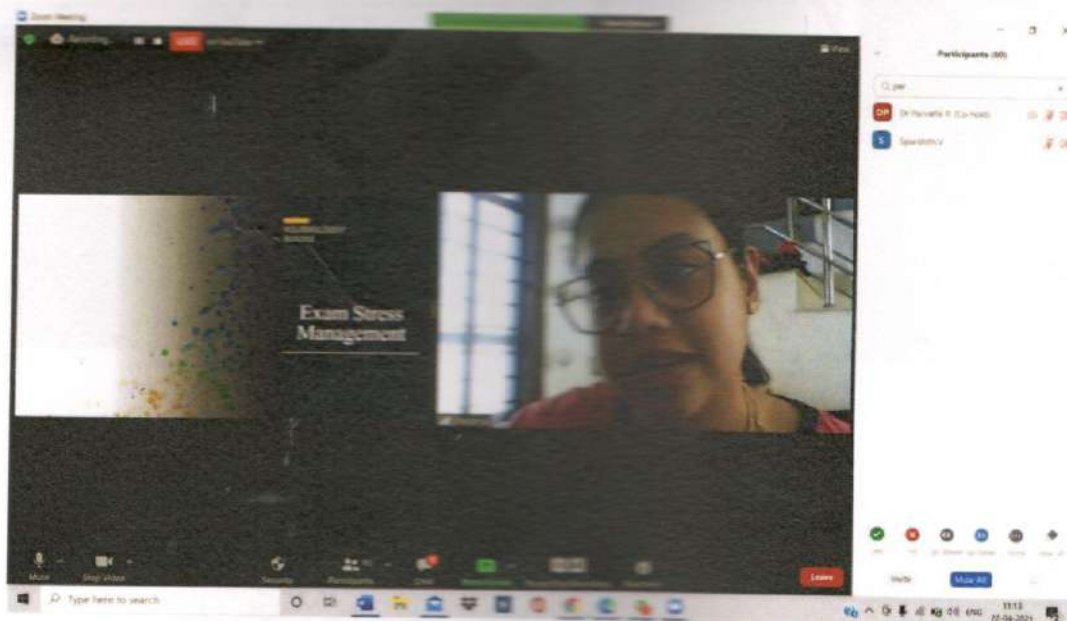

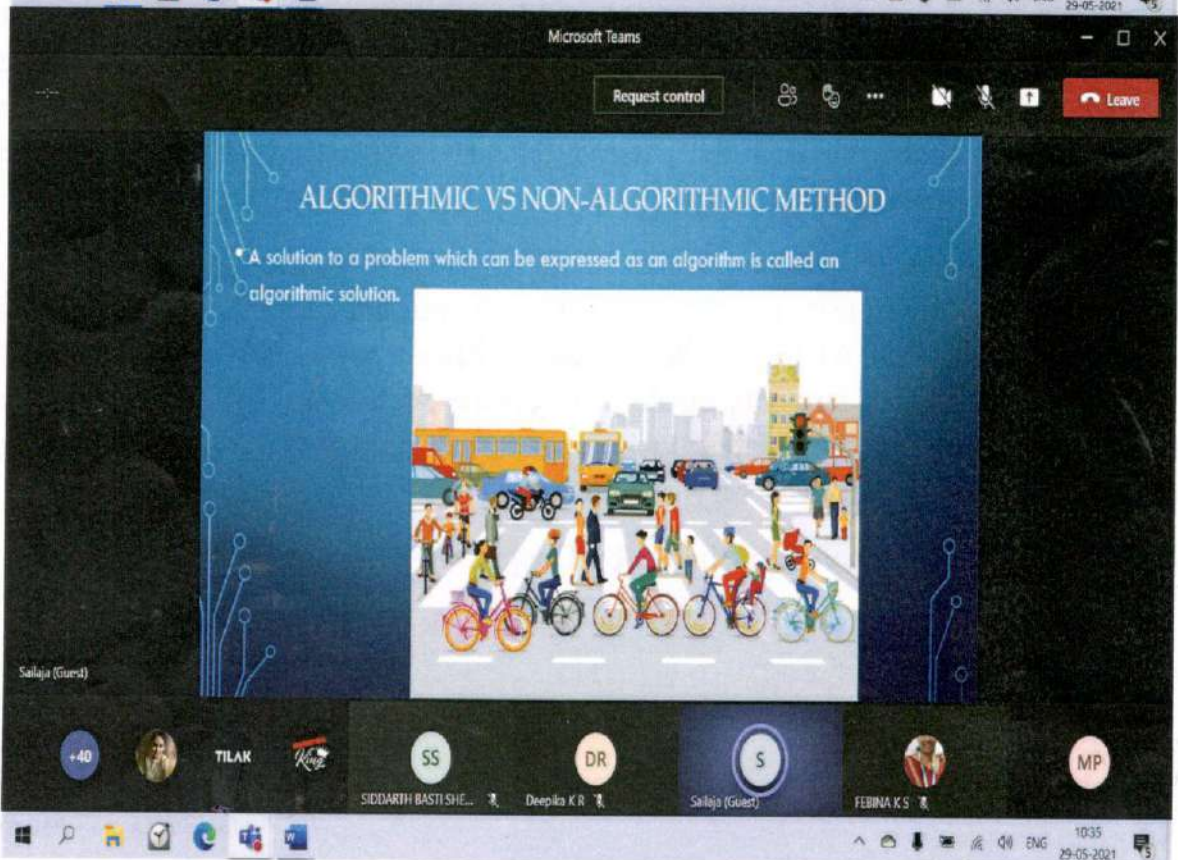

phenomenon among students especially when they have examination is at their door step and to strategies overcome the same among students during examination.

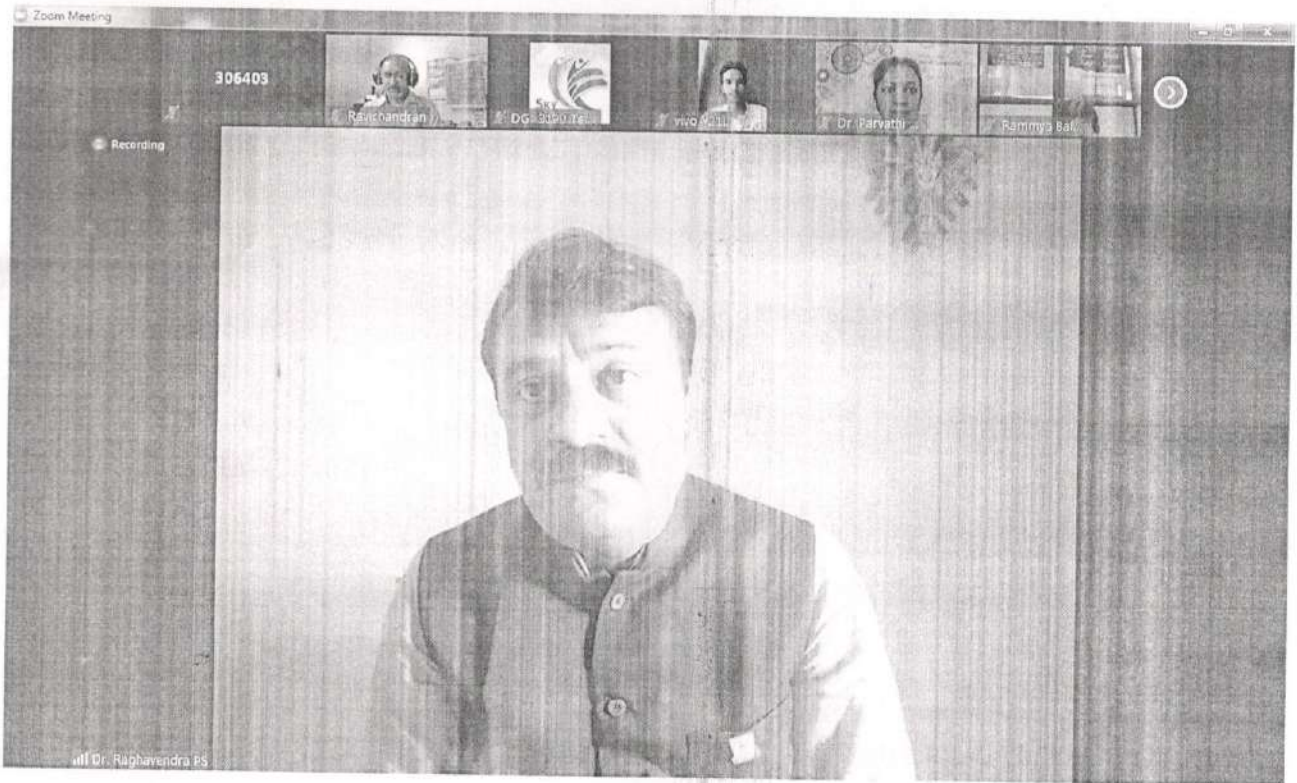

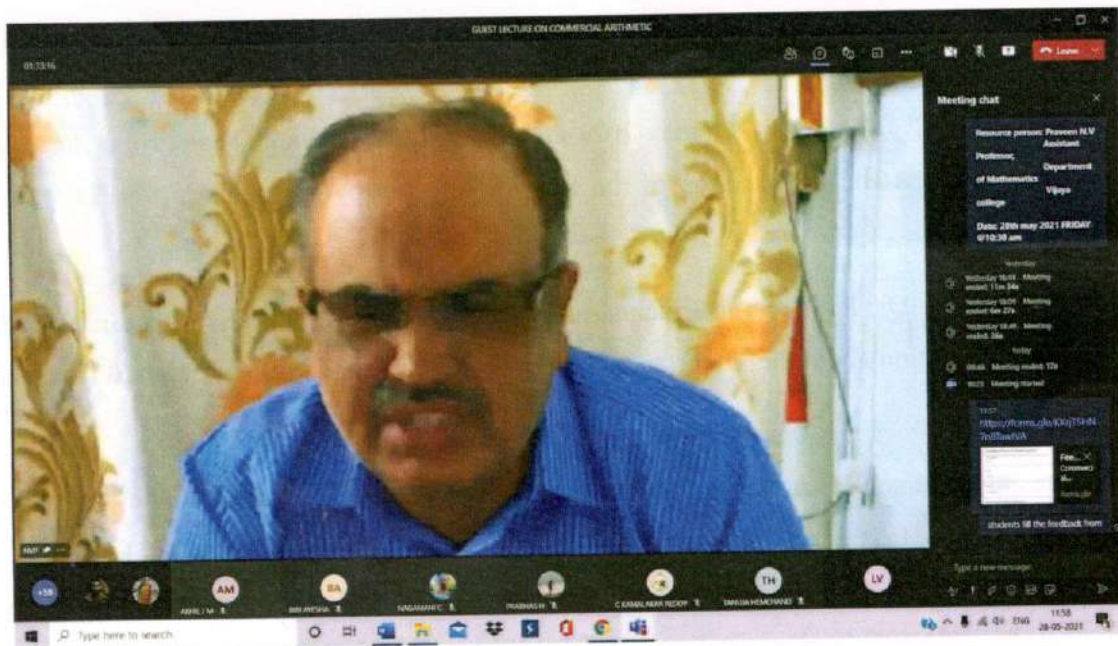
about the session and also students expressed their thankful for the speaker by telling it was an interactive session.

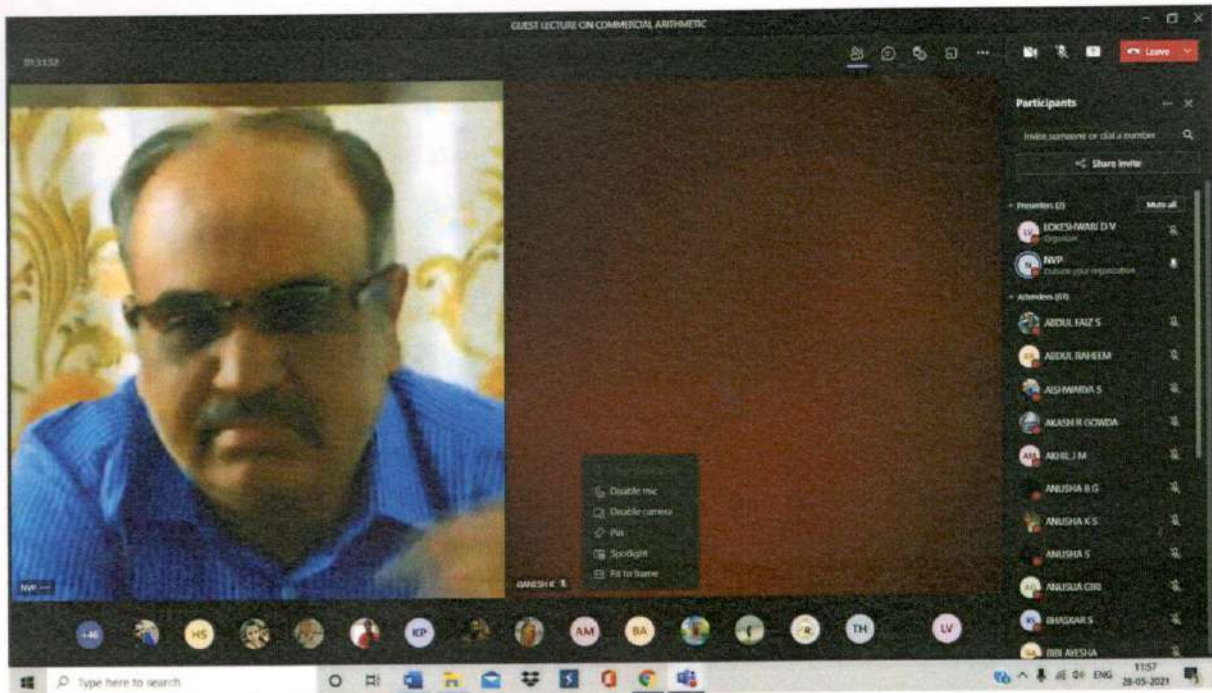

Problem:
 2) Compute the amount and compound interest on ₹10,000 compounded annually for $2\frac{1}{2}$ years at 4% per annum.

Solution: $P = ₹10,000$, $T = n = 2\frac{1}{2}$ years $R = 4\%$ per annum
 $n = 2\frac{1}{2} = 2\frac{2}{4} = 2\frac{2}{2} \Rightarrow a = 2, \frac{b}{c} = \frac{2}{2}$ [Half year $\frac{6}{12}$ months]

$$A = P \left(1 + \frac{R}{100}\right)^a \left(1 + \frac{\frac{b}{c}R}{100}\right)^c$$

$$A = 10000 \left(1 + \frac{4}{100}\right)^2 \left(1 + \frac{\frac{4}{2}}{100}\right) = 10000 \left(1 + \frac{4}{100}\right)^2 \left(1 + \frac{2}{100}\right)$$

$$A = 10000 (1.0816) (1.02) = ₹11,022.32$$

Compound Interest = $A - P = 11,022.32 - 10,000 = 1022.32$
