Short term courses

Advanced Draping

A 30-hour short-term value-added course on Advanced Draping was organized for V Semester B.Sc. Fashion & Apparel Design students, with 23 participants, coordinated by Ms. Bharathi P.S, Head of the Department. This course aimed to deepen students' understanding of draping principles, fabric behaviour, and the construction of innovative garment silhouettes. Students were trained in advanced techniques including cowl drapes, halter necks, butterfly twist bodices, circular skirts, peplums, and evening gowns. Through intensive hands-on sessions, they gained technical mastery and enhanced their creativity in developing high-fashion apparel. The course enabled students to bridge design theory with practical application, preparing them for industry-level garment development.



Advanced Fashion Illustration

A 30-hour short-term value-added course on Advanced Fashion Illustration was conducted for III Semester B.Sc. FAD students, with 24 participants, under the guidance of Ms. Shilpa R, Assistant Professor. The course aimed to strengthen students' skills in developing professional fashion portfolios by focusing on figure proportions, stylized drawing, rendering techniques, and fabric illustration. Students explored advanced concepts such as figure foreshortening, collage methods like montage and frottage, and expressive fashion sketching styles. The sessions enabled students to visualize design ideas more creatively and communicate them effectively through impactful illustrations.



Basic Painting Techniques



A 30-hour short-term value-added course on Basic Painting Techniques was offered to I Semester B.Sc. FAD students, with 5 participants. Coordinated by Ms. Ambily I.P, Assistant Professor, the course introduced students to essential drawing and painting methods, focusing on rendering, detailing, and creative expression. Students explored various techniques including hatching, stippling, shading, texture rendering, and experimented with acrylics and watercolours, applying both basic and advanced styles like wet-on-wet, dry brush, and sgraffito. The course helped build strong foundational skills in visual art and design.

Industrial Visits & Field trips

Vastrabhushana 2024 – Textile & Jewellery Exhibition Visit

On 27th September 2024 at 2:00 PM, the Department of B.Sc. Fashion & Apparel Design organized a visit to Vastrabhushana 2024, held at Sindhoora Convention Center, J.P. Nagar, Bengaluru, with the participation of 46 students and 4 faculty members. The exhibition was a vibrant celebration of India's rich legacy in textiles, jewellery, and craftsmanship. Students and faculty explored stunning handwoven sarees, dupattas, embroidered kurtis, accessories, and a striking collection of silver oxidized jewellery and lac bangles. The display featured diverse traditional crafts including Chikankari, Ajrakh, Banarasi, Madhubani, Batik, Ikat, and hand-painted textiles, offering deep insights into heritage techniques and sustainable fashion practices. Interactions with artisans enriched the experience, as students learned about the cultural narratives and skills behind each piece. The visit highlighted the importance of craft revival, sustainability, and experiential learning in fashion education, motivating aspiring designers to merge traditional artistry with contemporary design.



Niche Handloom Marketing Expo 2024-25

On 30th December 2024 at 1:00 PM, 30 students from B.Sc. FAD and M.Com, along with 4 faculty members, visited the Niche Handloom Marketing Expo at Shubh Convention Centre, JP Nagar, Bengaluru, organized by the Weavers Service Center, Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India. The expo served as a vibrant platform celebrating India's diverse handloom heritage, with artisans from Maharashtra, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, and West Bengal showcasing both traditional and contemporary creations. Key exhibits included Paithani, Kanchipuram, Banarasi, Jamdani, Tussar, Mul Cotton, Ikat, Ilkal, and Patola sarees, as well as Kalamkari and block-printed dress materials, handloom accessories, and furnishings. Students interacted with weavers, gaining insights into eco-friendly practices, traditional textile techniques, and the practical aspects of marketing and production. The visit offered valuable inspiration for upcoming design projects and reinforced the significance of sustainable, heritage-based fashion, deepening the students' appreciation for India's textile legacy and its relevance in contemporary design.

Seminars

Luxury & Fashion: The Impact of Counterfeit Products on Consumers

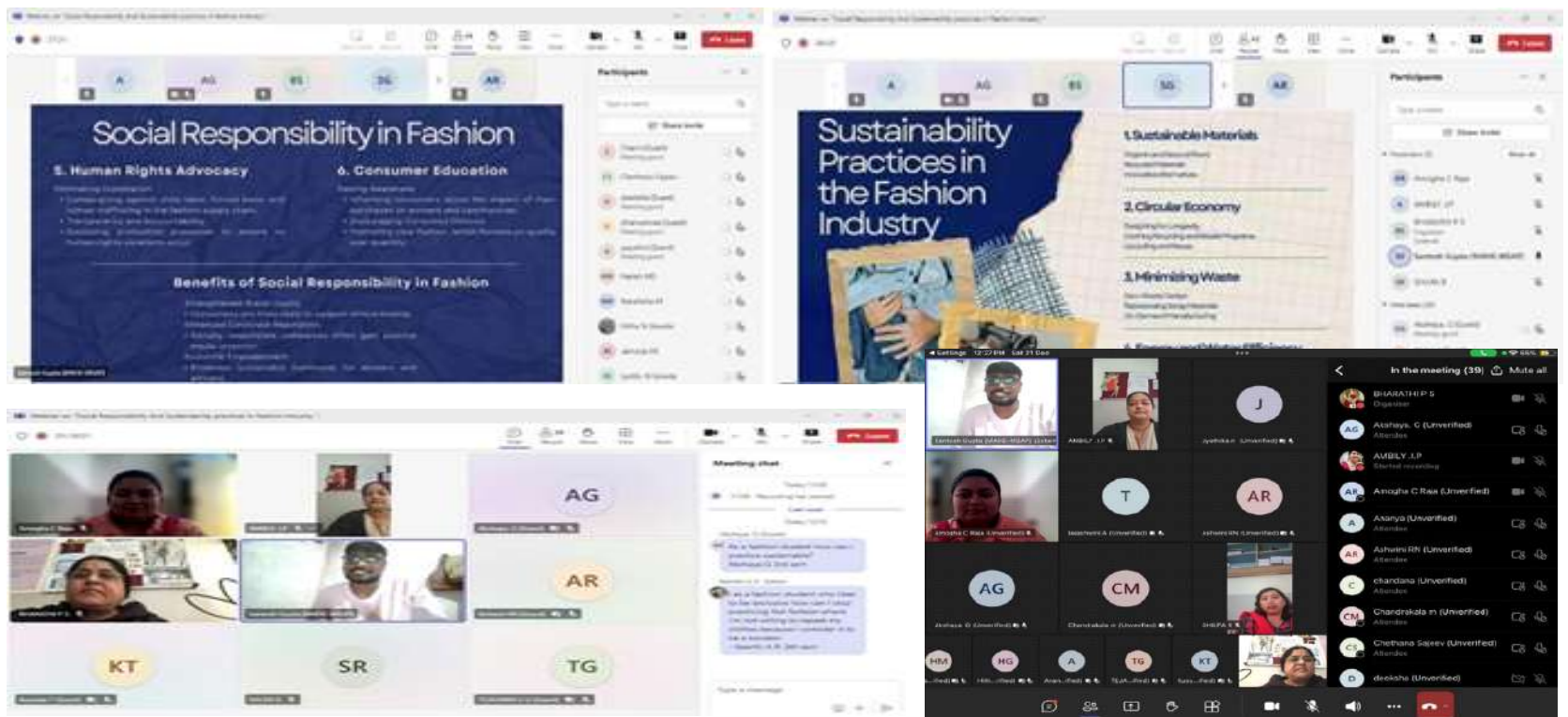
On 20th March 2025, the Department of B.Sc Fashion & Apparel Design hosted a seminar on "Luxury & Fashion: The Impact of Counterfeit Products on Consumers", attended by 33 students and 3 faculty members. The session was led by Ms. Priyanka Gulge, a seasoned luxury retail expert with over 15 years of experience working with brands like Louis Vuitton, Sephora, Fossil, and MAC. She offered in-depth insights into luxury brand strategies, consumer psychology, sustainability, and the damaging effects of counterfeit products. Students actively participated in interactive discussions on brand identity, color psychology, anti-counterfeit technologies like RFID and blockchain, and ethical retail practices. The department extended special thanks to Mrs. Shammim Unnisabi, Head of Placement, for facilitating the seminar in collaboration with Galileo Global Education. The session proved to be an enriching experience, bridging academic learning with real-world industry perspectives.



Webinars

Social Responsibility and Sustainability Practices in the Fashion Industry

On 21st December 2024, the Department of B.Sc. Fashion and Apparel Design organized a virtual webinar on the topic "Social Responsibility and Sustainability Practices in the Fashion Industry" via Microsoft Teams. He highlighted the role of fashion designers in embracing sustainable materials, promoting fair labor practices, and contributing to the circular economy. The webinar also explored how sustainability can be integrated into every stage of the fashion lifecycle.



Associate Quality Professional (AQP) Orientation Session



The Department of B.Sc. Fashion & Apparel Design, in association with RSJ Inspection Service Ltd., organized a virtual orientation session on 6th February 2025 for 48 students of B.Sc. FAD and BCA, along with faculty members. The session, held on Microsoft Teams, introduced the Associate Quality Professional (AQP) program—a CSR initiative aimed at building students' technical, communication, and quality management skills.

Competitions Draping Competition - 2024

The Draping Competition organized by the Department of B.Sc. Aimed at showcasing creativity and innovation in garment construction, the event encouraged students to explore various draping techniques using muslin. Four teams, each comprising five members, crafted elegant and imaginative gowns, paying close attention to detail and fit. The competition created a vibrant and encouraging learning environment and was appreciated by the judge for the exceptional artistry and execution. The 1st place was secured by Ms. Jyothika N, Ms. Dhanushree, Ms. Shakthi, Ms. Ashwini R.N, and Ms. Ananya C.G. 2nd place was jointly awarded to the teams of Ms. Harshitha M, Ms. Keerthi A.R, Ms. Varsha T, Ms. Supriya S.S, and Ms. Poornima R., and Ms. Kusuma T, Ms. Tejashwini A, Ms. Tejaswini H.G, Ms. Nisarga Y.T, and Mr. Sanjai M. 3rd place went to Ms. Gayathri B, Ms. Prathima S, Ms. Keerthana K.P, and Ms. Monalisa K.P. The competition was a resounding success, inspiring students to push creative boundaries in the art of draping.



Basic Sketching Competition – 2024

The Basic Pencil Sketching Competition was held on 31st December 2024 in the Designing Lab, providing a platform for students to demonstrate their fundamental sketching skills. Five participants showcased their creativity through pencil sketches based on the theme “Nature and Forms.” The event focused on essential techniques such as shading, proportions, composition, and line work. Students skillfully interpreted natural elements like plants, animals, and landscapes, producing artworks that reflected both technical strength and artistic expression. Sketches were judged on technical skill, creativity, composition, and execution. Ms. Manogna M.D secured the 1st Prize for her exceptional interpretation and execution. All participants received certificates in recognition of their talent and enthusiasm. The event successfully highlighted the importance of sketching as a foundation in design education.



Creative Fashion Sketching Competition - 2024

The Creative Fashion Sketching Competition was held on 28th December 2024 in the Designing Lab, organized by the Department of B.Sc. A total of 23 students participated, each demonstrating their ability to translate fashion ideas into original sketches, reflecting strong artistic talent and design understanding. The competition began with an orientation session, outlining the rules and judging criteria, which included creativity, technical execution, and theme relevance. Students were given a specific time to complete their sketches using various art materials, with a focus on concept and individual style. The panel of judges evaluated the entries based on originality, aesthetic appeal, and the execution of the theme. The event emphasized the significance of sketching in fashion and encouraged students to explore their design potential. The top performers were awarded for their exceptional work: I Prize – Ms. Jamuna V.K, II Prize – Ms. Nikitha N, III Prize – Ms. Prerana Nikam, with Consolation Prizes – Ms. Akshaya G and Ms. Jyothi N. All participants received certificates, making the event both competitive and encouraging for emerging fashion illustrators.

A team of ten students from the Department of B.Sc. Fashion & Apparel Design participated in KALOPSIA 2024, an intercollegiate fashion show hosted by Presidency College, Bengaluru, on 24th September 2024. Their themed collection, "Scarlet Shadows – Draped in Whimsy," creatively blended the mystique of Halloween with the vibrancy of Mexico's Day of the Dead, using red and black draped ensembles to reflect contrasting emotions of life, death, and celebration. It was supported by five student coordinators, the team showcased impressive styling, fabric manipulation, and conceptual depth. Though they didn't qualify for the final round, the students earned appreciation for originality and execution, gaining valuable experience and exposure in competitive fashion presentation.



Acharya Design Week 2024 – Intercollegiate Competitions

Students from the Department of B.Sc. Fashion and Apparel Design actively participated in a series of intercollegiate competitions during Acharya Design Week, held from 25th to 29th November 2024 at Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies, Bengaluru. Across events like logo design, doodling, art, still life, fashion styling, and a fashion show, students showcased their creativity and design skills. Notably, Manogna M.D. (1st Sem) won 3rd place in the Doodle Competition, and Harshitha M. (5th Sem) secured 2nd place in Caricature Art. The fashion show team presented a collection titled "Threads of Time: From Ancient Looms to Modern Streets", celebrating a fusion of Indian textiles with Greco-Roman draping, receiving enthusiastic appreciation for concept and styling. Though not all entries placed, the event offered students valuable exposure, constructive feedback, and an opportunity to compete on a professional platform, strengthening their confidence and creative direction.



Parva 2025 – Intercollegiate Fashion Show at Seshadripuram Academy

Students from the Department of B.Sc. 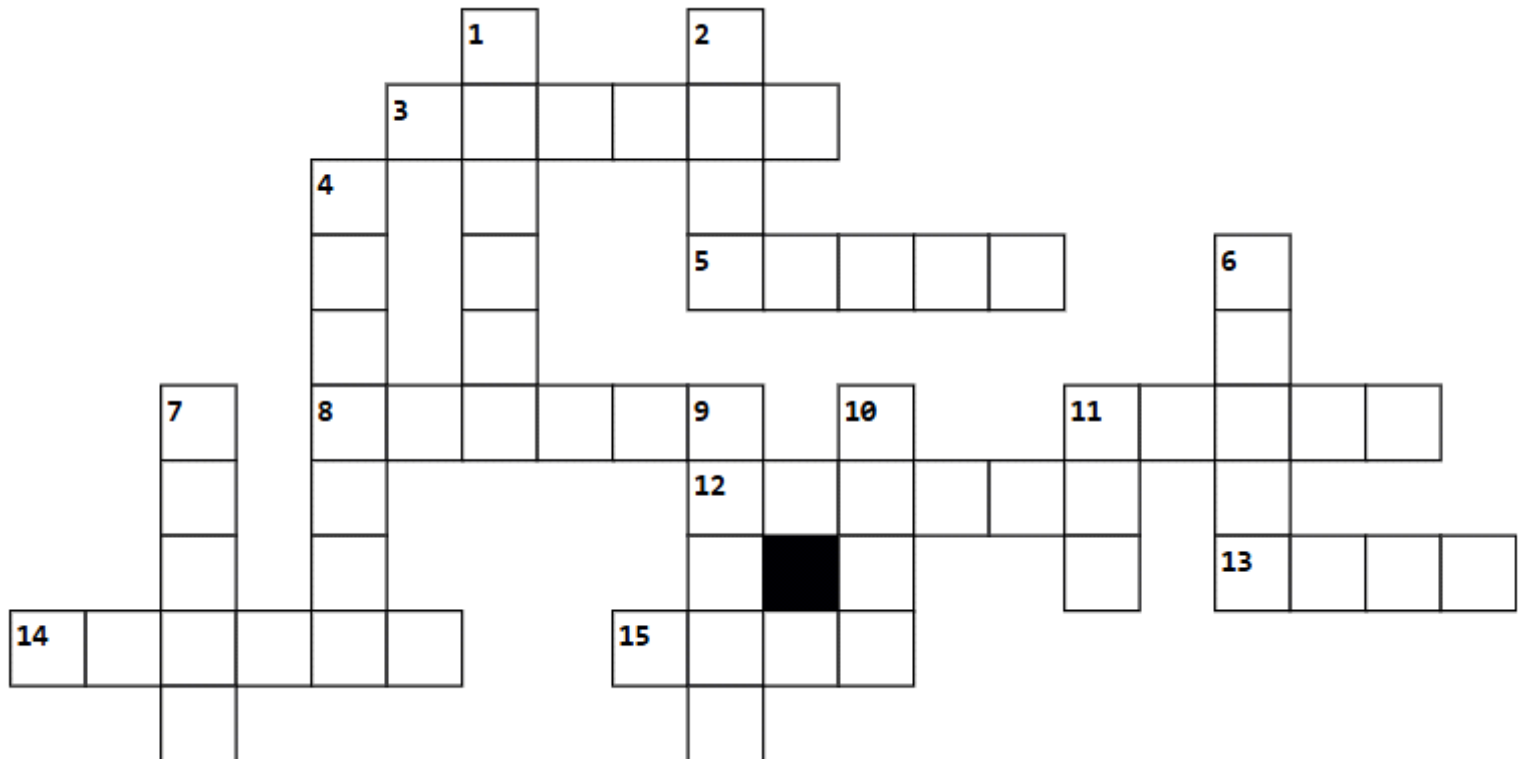
