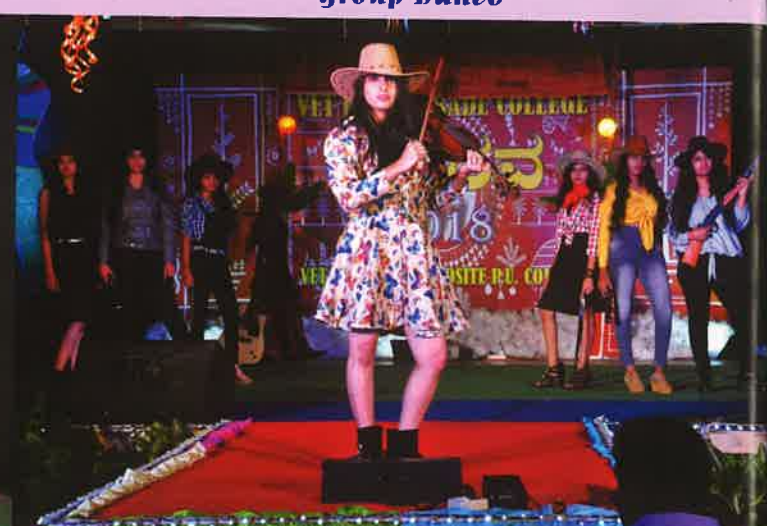

Human Rights With Karnataka Institute For Law and Parliamentary Reforms

Human rights are moral principles or norms that describe certain standards of human behaviour and are regularly protected as legal rights in municipal and international law. The programme commenced with seeking the blessings of almighty this bringing a divinity to the environment and followed by auspicious lamp lighting. Sri Narayanswamy S G, Vice principal, VET FGC welcomed the gathering of enthusiastic students and faculty. Dr Reviah Odeyar, Research Head, KILPAR started the seminar by delivering key note address.

Dr R Parvathi, Academic Director and Principal, VET Colleges, delivered the programme address and briefed the audience about the various aspects regarding the human rights to be discussed during the entire day. Ms. Nagalaskshmi Bai, President, State Women Commission, rendered the inaugural address which was an emotional, inspirational and motivational address. She touched on issues like human rights and women, harassment, child issues and gave many live examples. Chief Guest Sri Srinath, Principal secretary, Law Dept, also enlightened the gathering on the various issues relating to human rights. President Sri B R Viswanath Setty delivered the presidential address and highlighted the importance of human rights in individual lives. Honorary Secretary Sri Manandi N Suresh expresses his valuable opinion on the topic. The formal program ended with vote of Thanks proposed by Mrs. Gowri Hebbar, Asst Prof, Dept Of Commerce. The master of Ceremony for the programme was Mrs B Rammya, PG Coordinator, VET FGC.

The seminar was divide into 3 technical sessions on Human rights and Constitution, Human Rights and Women and Human rights and Human Rights and the depressed classes.

The first session was started by Asst Prof Mrs Shalini, Dept of Commerce giving a brief profile of the speaker Dr. K.B.Kempegowda, Principal, Vivekananda Law College. He spoke on Human rights enlightening on various rights that an individual has, how a right need to be exercised by citing many case studies, various basic and special rights available as per our constitution giving various real-life examples. His session was well received by the audience.

The second session began with Asst prof, Mr. Rangaswamy giving a brief introduction of the speaker Dr. Krishnappa, Asst Prof, Maharani Lakshmi Ammani College. He spoke on various issues relating to human rights and women, how can a woman protect their human rights, their position and

importance in the society, evolution of modern day women and concluded that a country can develop only when the women progresses in their lives and this requires the awareness among women among their basic human rights.

The audience posted question after the first and the second session regarding the rights of girl in ancestral property and many other issues. It was an excellent deliberative session.

The third session began after lunch and was commenced by Asst prof, Mr Vinod Kumar, Dept of Commerce introducing the speaker Dr. Subramanya Swamy. He spoke on human rights and depressed class including SC/ST/economically and financially backward people, rights of labourers, drain / sewage cleaners etc.

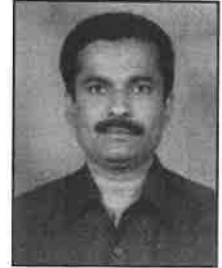

He wielded a spade near River Ganga at Assi Ghat in Varanasi under the Clean India Mission. Sanitation has emerged as a key issue since the 2011 Census highlighted a glaring data on lack of toilets in the country by stating that over 26 million people in India defecate in the open which reflects on health problems that roughly half of the Indians families have to deal with due to lack of proper toilets in their homes.

Save environment swach bharat

Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) on October 2, 2014, the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. The ambitious programme aims to make the streets, roads and infrastructure across the country clean by October 02, 2019, the 150th birth anniversary of the Father of the Nation. It is India's biggest ever cleanliness drive.

Sanitation has emerged as a key issue since the 2011 Census highlighted the glaring data on lack of toilets in the country by stating that over 26 million people in India defecate in the open. Launched with an estimated cost of around Rs 62,009 crore, Swachh Bharat Mission aims to achieve the elimination of open defecation in the country. Among its other objectives are conversion of insanitary toilets to pour flush toilets, putting an end to the inhuman practice of manual scavenging and carrying out Municipal Solid Waste Management (MSWM).

Launching the mission, Prime Minister had nominated nine famous personalities for the campaign. They joined the campaign and nominated nine more people. Thus, the momentum has been built with people from all walks of life joining it. Eminent personalities such as Aamir Khan, Amitabh Bachchan, Kailash Kher, Priyanka Chopra and leading sportspersons like Sachin Tendulkar, Sania Mirza, Saina Nehwal and Mary Kom are part of the SBM.

The urban component of the mission is being managed by the Union Ministry of Urban Development. Around three million government employees and school and college students of India participated in the event in its initial phase. The rural component of the mission is being handled by the Union Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation.

The mission aims to eradicate open defecation by 2019. Prime Minister while launching the SBM, called for making the goal of Swachh Bharat as a mass movement, with people taking a pledge to neither litter, nor let others litter.

Citing a World Health Organization estimate that an average of Rs. 6500 per person was lost in India due to lack of cleanliness and hygiene, the Prime Minister emphasised that a clean India would make a significant impact on public health. It would safeguard income of the poor, ultimately contributing to the national economy. He underlined that sanitation should not be seen as a political tool, but as manifestation of patriotism and contribution towards nation-building.

The mission aims to eliminate open defecation by constructing toilets for households, communities; abolishing manual scavenging; ushering in advanced municipal solid waste management practices; encouraging private sector involvement in the sanitation sector and last but not the least by bringing about attitudinal change with regard to sanitation.

Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh and Kerala are the three states that have been declared Open Defecation Free (ODF) this year. As per government data, as of December 16, over 58% of Indian households have become open defecation free. According to the Union Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Haryana, Uttarakhand, Gujarat and Punjab will achieve the ODF status by March 31, 2017.

Though the government is putting forward its best efforts, yet we have so far not received the desired result on the front of cleanliness. There is need of an attitudinal change on the part of all citizens to fulfil the mission of a clean India in its true spirit.

PATCH (COMPUTING)

Patch management is a part of lifecycle management, and is the process of using a strategy and plan of what patches should be applied to which systems at a specified time. A patch is a piece of software designed to update a computer program or its supporting update data, to fix or improve it. This includes fixing security vulnerabilities and other bugs, with such patches usually called bugfixes or bug fixes and improving the usability or performance although meant to fix problems, poorly designed patches can sometimes introduce new problems (see software regressions) in some special cases updates may knowingly break the functionality, for instance by removing components for which the update provider is no longer licensed or disabling a device

TYPES

Patches for proprietary software are typically distributed as executable files instead of source code. This type of patch modifies the program executable –the program the user actually runs –either by modifying the binary file to include the fixes or by completely replacing it on early 8-bit microcomputers, for example the RADIO SHAK TRS-80, the operating system include a PATCH utility which accepted the patch data from a text file and applied the fixes to the target programs executed binary file (s) small in –memory patches could be manually applied with the system debug utility, such as (P/M'S DOT OR MS-DOS'SDEBUG debugger. Programmers working in interpreting BASIC often used the POKE command to temporarily alter the functionality of a system service routine.

Patches can also circulate in the form of source code modification in the case, the patches usually consist of textual differences between 2 source code file, called “diffs” this types of patches commonly come out of open-source projects.in these cases, developed except users to compile the new or changed files themselves.

Bulkly patches or patches that significantly change a program may circulates as “service packs” or as “software update” Microsoft windows NT and its successors (including windows 2000, windows XP, windows vista and windows 7) use the “service patch” terminology.

SYSTEMSSOFTWARE UPDATE

Software update system allow for updates to be managed by users and software developers.in the 2017 PETYA CYBERPANDEMIC the financial software “MC DOC”S update system is said to have been compromised to spread malware via its updates. On the Tor Blog cybersecurity distributed builds are likely the only way to defend against malware that attaches the software development and build process to infect millions of machines in a single, officially signed, instantaneous update. Update managers of LINUX such as synaptic allow users to update all software installed on their machine, application like synaptic use cryptographic checksums to verify source / local files before they are applied to ensure fidelity against malware.

Technology Is Boon Or Bane

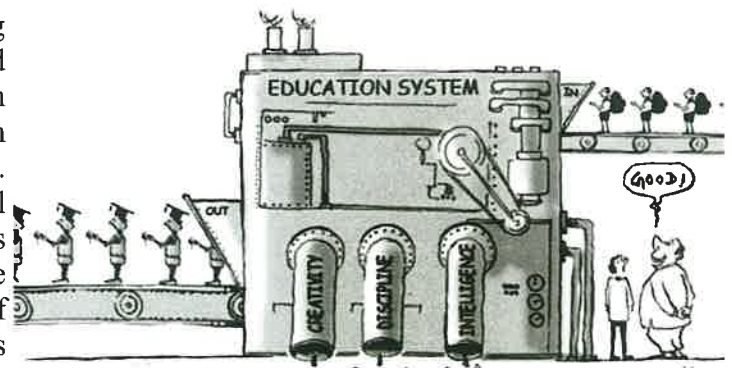

Latest Computer Software

Computer software, or simply software, is a part of a computer system that consists of data or computer instructions, in contrast to the physical hardware from which the system is built. In computer science and software engineering, computer software is all information processed by computer systems, programs and data. Computer software includes computer programs, libraries and related non-executable data, such as online documentation or digital media. Software is written in high-level programming languages that are easier and more efficient for programmers to use because they are closer than machine languages to natural languages. High-level languages are translated into machine language using a compiler or an interpreter or a combination of the two. Software may also be written in a low-level assembly language, which has strong correspondence to the computer's machine language instructions and is translated into machine language using an assembler.

The first piece of software was written by Ada Lovelace in the 19th century, for the planned Analytical Engine. However, neither the Analytical Engine nor any software for it were ever created.

This eventually led to the creation of the twin academic fields of computer science and software engineering, which both study software and its creation. Computer science is more theoretical, where as software engineering focuses on more practical's. However, prior to 1946, software as we now understand it—programs stored in digital computers. The first electronic computing devices were instead rewired in order to "reprogram" them.

Types:

Application software

Which is software that uses the computer system to perform special functions or provide entertainment functions beyond the basic operation of the computer itself.

System software

which is software that directly operates the computer hardware, to provide basic functionality needed by users and other software, and to provide a platform for running application software.

Operating systems

which are essential collections of software that manage resources and provides common services for other software that runs "on top" of them. Supervisory programs, boot loaders, shells and window systems are core parts of operating systems. In practice, an operating system comes bundled with additional software (including application software) so that a user can potentially do some work with a computer that only has one operating system.

Device drivers

which operate or control a particular type of device that is attached to a computer. Each device needs at least one corresponding device driver; because a computer typically has at minimum at least one input device and at least one output device, a computer typically needs more than one device driver. Programming tools are also software in the form of programs or applications that software developers (also known as programmers, coders, hackers or software engineers) use to create, debug, maintain, or otherwise support software. Software is written in one or more programming languages; there are many programming languages in existence, and each has at least one implementation, each of which consists of its own set of programming tools. These tools may be relatively self-contained programs such as compilers, debuggers, interpreters, linkers, and text editors, that can be combined together to accomplish a task; or they may form an integrated development environment (IDE), which combines much or all of the functionality of such self-contained tools.

Design and implementation:

Main articles: Software development, Computer programming, and engineering. Design and implementation of software varies depending on the complexity of the software. For instance, the design and creation of Microsoft Word took much more time than designing and developing Microsoft Notepad because the letter has much more basic functionality. Software is usually designed and created(coded/written/programmed) in integrated development environments (IDE) like Eclipse, and Microsoft Visual Studio that can simplify the process and compile the software. As noted in a different section, software is usually created on top of existing software and the application programming interface (API) that the underlying software provides like GTK+, Java Beans or Swing. Libraries can

be categorized by their purpose. For instance, the Spring Framework is used for implementing enterprise applications, the Windows Forms library is used for designing graphical user interface (GUI) applications like Microsoft Word, and Windows Communication Foundation is used for designing web services. When a program is designed, it relies upon the API. For instance, if a user is designing a Microsoft Windows desktop application, he or she might use the .NET Windows Forms library to design the desktop application and call its APIs like to close or open the application, and write the additional operations that it needs to have. Without these APIs, the programmer needs to write these APIs. Companies like Oracle and Microsoft provide their own APIs so that many applications are written using their software libraries that usually have numerous APIs in them. Data such as hash tables, arrays, and binary trees, and algorithms such as quick sort, can be useful for creating software. Computer software has special economic characteristics that make its design, creation, and distribution. A person who creates software is called a programmer, software engineer or software developer, terms that all have a similar meaning. More informal terms for programmer also exist such as "coder" and "hacker" – although use of the latter word may cause confusion, because it is more often used to mean someone who illegally breaks into computer systems.



Top five advantages of the Latest software

1. Reduced time to benefit: Different from the traditional model, in the software (application) is already installed and configured. The user has the advantage of provisioning the server for an instance in cloud and in a couple hours they can have the application ready for use. This reduces the time spent in installation and configuration, and can reduce the issues that can get in the way of the software deployment.

2. Lower costs: has a differential regarding costs since it usually resides in a shared or multitenant environment where the hardware and software license costs are low compared with the traditional model. Another advantage is that the customer base can be increased since it allows small and medium businesses (SMB) to use a software that otherwise they would not use due to the high cost of license.

Maintenance costs are reduced as well, since the provider owns the environment and it is split among all customers that use that solution.

3. Scalability and integration: Usually, solutions reside in cloud environments that are scalable and have integration with other offerings. Comparing with the traditional model, users do not have to buy another server or software. They only need to enable a new offering and, in terms of server capacity planning, the provider will own that.

4. New releases (upgrades): providers upgrade the solution and it becomes available for their customers. Costs and effort associated with upgrades and new releases are lower than the traditional model that usually forces the user to buy an upgrade package and install it, or pay for specialized services to get the environment upgraded.

5. Easy to use and perform proof of concepts: offerings are easy to use since they already come with best practices and samples inside it. Users can do proof of concepts and test the software functionality or a new release feature in advance. Also, they can have more than one instance with different versions and do a smooth migration. Even for large environments, users can use offerings to test the software before buy it.
