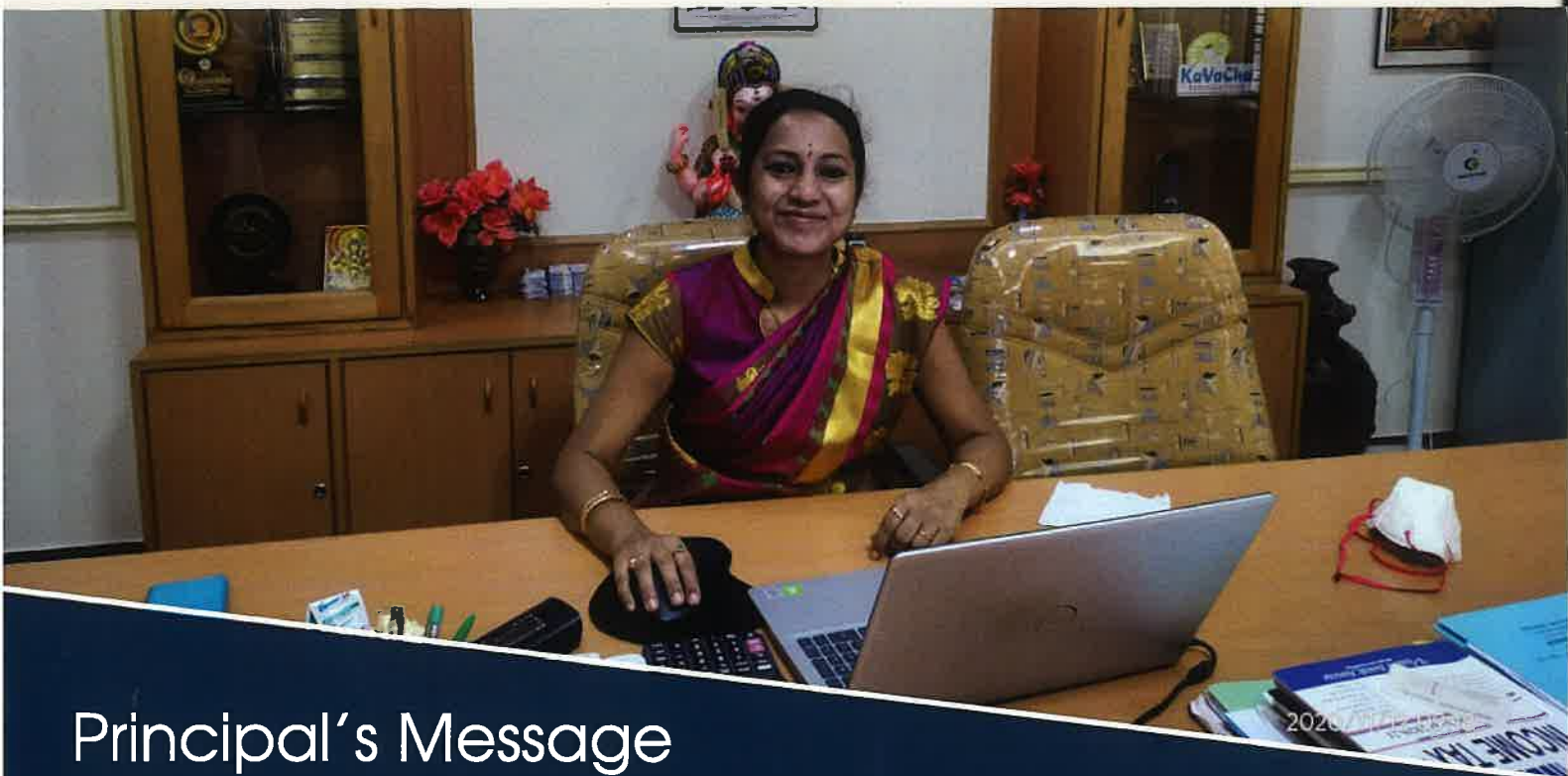

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

"Multidisciplinary Research on Challenges to Change and Development"

19th February 2020 was a milestone in the history of VET First Grade College as it organized its maiden International Conference titled "Multidisciplinary Research on Challenges to Change and Development". The conference started with a digital inauguration by Dr R Parvathi, Academic Director and Principal VET Colleges and Plenary Session speaker Prof. Suresh Raghavendra, Director Human Resources, GIRMITI Software.

The conference was organized as under

- Plenary Session I and II – Technology Disruption and its impact on Global Economy
- Formal Inauguration
- Technical Session and Paper Presentation
- Valedictory Session

Plenary Session:

Ms B. Rammya, Organising Secretary of the conference started the Plenary Session with a brief introduction of Prof. Suresh Raghavendra who is also a visiting Professor at IIM Bangalore. After this, the session was handed over to the resource person. He spoke on the current changes taking place in the varied fields and industry as a whole. He spoke on the theme: Technology Disruption and its impact on Global economy. He appealed to the audience to embrace change and equip themselves with the necessary tools to face the challenges that come and evolve as change drivers and agents. The entire 45 minutes of the session paved a way for a great start for the conference.

Next, Ms. Rammya, introduced the second Plenary session speaker – Mr. Thomas Henderson and handed over the session to him for his address. Mr. Henderson who is basically from Korea started the session on how North Korea combated the challenges during war times and emerged as a developed nation setting example for change and development. He emphasized that the mindset of the individual is required to undergo a change for a country and community to grow and develop in true sense. His address captivated the audience for 50 minutes.

After the Plenary Session II, both the resource people were felicitated.

Formal Inauguration:

Ms Shilpa R, IQAC Coordinator and Convener of the Conference, proceeded with the formal inauguration of the Conference. The dignitaries – Sri B R Viswanath Setty, President of VET, Dr. Manandi N Suresh, Honorary Secretary VET, Ms Sreema Setty, Keynote speaker and Dr. R Parvathi, Principal and Academic Director graced the seats on the dias. The programme started with invocation song by Ms Abharna, Ms Bhargavi and Ms Tanuja – the staff members of the college followed by lighting the lamp by the dignitaries. Dr R Parvathi welcomed the gathering and gave a brief account of the

Conference and highlighted that the college has received research papers from 334 authors and the day would witness the release of 3 books. She expressed gratitude to all the authors and co-authors for placing trust on the college and appreciated their efforts in coming up with original research articles.

Ms Shilpa thanked Dr. R Parvathi for her words of welcome and continued with the reading out of detailed profile of Ms Sreema Setty, the Key note speaker – Transformation Leader, Director Metro AG Germany. The floor was later thrown open to Ms Sreema for her address. She started the session by first thanking the institution for giving her the opportunity. She then went on to the main theme of the conference – Challenges to Change and Develop. She made the session digitally very interactive and kept the audience glued on to her slides till the end of her session which lasted for 50 minutes. She circulated a bar code and asked the audience to vote for the serious challenge faced by Bangalore City in today's scenario. Most of the responses were directed towards traffic and pollution. She extrapolated the data on the LED screen using the App as the audience was giving the responses. Through this exercise, she passes on the message that changes is the one permanent thing sustaining in today's world and is the basic ingredient for growth and development. She also interacted with the audience and made them give suggestions to address the major challenge Bangalore City is facing. It was very informative, interactive and digitally appealing to the audience. The session was well received by the audience and as per online feedback mechanism, 45% rated her address as Excellent and 49% rated it as Good.

This was followed by the Presidential address by Sri B R Viswanath Setty and address by Honorary Secretary Dr. Manadi N Suresh. The Conference witnessed the release of 3 books

The formal programme concluded with vote of thanks proposed by Ms Prathima B J, HOD Dept. of Commerce. Ms Shilpa requested the audience to proceed for hi-tea, followed by Technical Session and Panel discussion.

Technical Session / Panel Discussion and Paper Presentation

The session commenced after a short tea break. The technical session of commerce and management stream was scheduled in the auditorium and chaired by Dr. S Ramesh, Dr. Aravinda Reddy, Dr. Jalaja, Dr. Bhargavi, Dr. Srinivas Mane and Dr. Sathya Bhama B N. The resource persons discussed about the sub-themes and started with the presentation. The presentations were held in 3 places – auditorium, Room No 105 and Room No 007. The track was organized into 3 with 1 track for faculty and 2 for students. The in-charge for the track was Ms Jyothi, Ms Gowri Hebbar and Ms. Ashwini. There were 18 presenters in Track 1 and 55 presenters in Track 2 and 3. Each of them presented their rich experience and research in the fields of finance, marketing, human resources and information technologies related to business. It was a rich knowledge sharing platform.

The English track witnessed presentations from 25 presenters and was chaired by Prof Narasimhan and Prof Ravikumar and rightly assisted by Ms Mamatha and Ms Abharana as organizers. The

presenters gave presentations on varied areas like Social transformation through literature, English – a challenging language for rural students and many more. The presentations happened in Lecture Hall 110 in the first floor.

The Kannada track was divided into 2 tracks and had presentations from over 36 research scholars and academicians. They presented on themes like Kannda Samvardaneya Savalugalu, Pradeshika Bashe Mathu Jagadikarna and many more. The chairperson for the tracks was Dr. Lingarajiah Belekere, Dr. D K Nataraju, Dr. Subramanya swamy, Dr. Padmini Nagaraju. The tracks were arranged in Lecture Halls 201 and 202 in the second floor and well coordinated by Mr. Narayanaswamy S G and Mr. Rangaswamy H T.

The Hindi Track was organized in PG Lecture Hall 008 and witnessed presentations from 13 academicians. The track was chaired and judged by Dr Vinay Kumar Yadav and Dr Babitha and event organizers were Ms Indrani and Ms Meera. The presenters deliberated on various changes the Hindi language has undergone and addressed on the challenges the language is facing today.

The Allied fields track witnessed a total of 4 presentations and was arranged in PG Lecture Hall 007. The chairperson for the track was Dr H Muralidharan and the organisers were Ms Arpitha, Ms Madhu and Mr. Rajath. The presenters shared their knowledge on climate change, sustainability, global dimensions etc to name a few.

The Information Technology track witnessed 7 presentations and was chaired by Dr Sajjan Mathew and Dr Parvati Angadi. The organizers who coordinated the track were Ms Febina and Ms Nagaveni in Lecture Hall 302 in the third floor. Deliberations revolved on IOT – its challenges and changes that need to be made to grow and develop.

The Fashion Technology track witnessed presentations from 6 presenters on the topics like IOT in Fashion, Green and sustainable fashion and many more. The chairperson for the track was Dr Sudhakar and Dr. Kauvery Bai and the event was well coordinated by Ms Ambily and Ms Swapna.

All the tracks were simultaneously organized in 9 different rooms including Auditorium and Lecture Halls. The lunch break was given from 1.15pm to 2.00pm and was availed by various tracks as per the convenience of Chairman, presenters and participants. The presentations continued post lunch as well till their completion. There was a wide dissemination of knowledge based on research on challenges to change and develop in various disciplines of the conference and everyone took back a lot of new learning's from the conference.

Valedictory Session

The valedictory session started at 4.30pm after the completion of all the presentations and was compere by Ms B Rammya, Organising Secretary of the conference. The ritual of welcoming the gathering was rendered by Ms Gowri Hebbar from Dept of Commerce. Sri B R Viswanath Setty delivered the concluding remarks on the conference and appreciated the team work and leadership ability of Dr R Parvathi in making the conference a grand success.

This was followed by honoring of the Chairpersons of various tracks by President and Dr R Parvathi. The next was the much awaited event – awards announcing and distribution of awards to the Best

Presenter and Paper. The Best Paper awards were as under

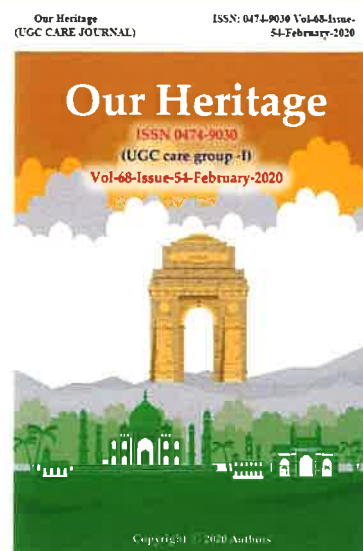

Workshop On “Effective Study Skills And Efficiency Techniques

Finally he worked out problems on payback period. Accounting rate of return, average rate of return and also problems on net present value and session ended by advising the students about their future.

Martyrs Day

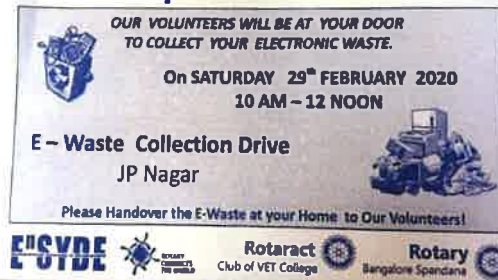
